Every Student, Every Day Champion - Todd Hoovler, Strategic Entrepreneurship Instructor

Mrs. Nikia Fletcher, Director of College and Career Readiness introduced Mr. Todd Hoovler as our Every Student, Every Day Champion. Mrs. Fletcher said that when she was offered her current position she was told that she had a terrific staff. They were not wrong, about that. Mr. Hoovler is out there, connected to the community and is always promoting his program and students. Mr. Hoovler currently teaches the Entrepreneurship Class at Mansfield Senior High School. Previously he taught Career Based Intervention (CBI) and Social Studies. Mr Hoovler has also coached soccer, tennis and is the ski club advisor. Throughout his career he has worked to "help at-risk students get on track to timely graduation while developing their employability and independent living skills." He has collaborated with local agencies to support youth summer work readiness and youth employment.

SAFE Program Update - Dr. Holly Christy, Homeless Liaison

Dr. Holly Christie gave the board an update on services and supports that the SAFE program has provided this year. Dr. Christie stated that so far her team has identified 270 students in the district who are homeless. The majority (239) of those students are doubled up with family or friends. Dr. Christie introduced her staff Phil Mitchel, Co-Coordinator – Barb Kern Co-Coordinator and Kathy Goodwin, Community Health Worker, through Third St. Clinic. Mr. Michel and Mrs. Kern work with the building secretaries to help identify families who are experiencing homelessness and provide them with their basic needs like clothing, food, toiletries, school supplies and even access to entertainment for the families. We are able

to furnish these supports due in large to the generous donations of people and businesses in our community. The New Store and Altrusa are our two major donators to the SAFE program along with Ann Brown of Brown Realty Mgmt. and the YMCA. Countless others from our school community, churches and private individuals donated Christmas donations this year and 154 children were gifted Christmas presents. Ms. Goodwin our community health worker has served 73 families, working with families to find resources, jobs, and assistance with finding affordable housing. The SAFE team took the board on a tour of the Tyger Den at Raemelton where families can shop and select items that they need for their students.

Manfield Senior High School Update - Robert McQuate, Principal

Mr. McQuate addressed the board with an update regarding Attendance and how they are trying to address the issue. He also shared that they are working with At-Risk students, trying to identify what factor's (attendance, academics or behavior) are putting the student at-risk and trying to focus on improvement in that specific area. Mr. McQuate then introduced Mr.Brad Kentosh and Mr. Nick Boller who recently started two new clubs to Mansfield Sr. High. Mr. Kentosh has had some requests this year from students to start a Chess Club. Mr. McQuate had recently been contacted by Mr. Bill Asher, a former Drama Teacher and Chess Club Advisor wanting to donate materials and assist in creating a new Chess Club. Together, Mr. Kentosh and Mrs. Asher are looking forward to working with the students and possibly competing with other schools. Mr. Nick Boller has recently created an E-Sports club and has had an overwhelming response and interest from middle school and high school students. This is an extra-curricular activity that appeals to a wide range of students, and for many their first extra-curricular interest. Mr. Boller sited several districts in the area that offer E-Sports and hopes to develop competitions between our area schools.
