Every Student, Every Day - Outstanding Tygers

Track Athletes Keontez Bradely, Maurice Ware and Amil Upchurch were recognized by Athletic Director, Kevin Porter for their outstanding track season.

Keontez Bradley competed in the 400-meter dash during the OHSAA State Track Meet at Ohio State University's Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium in Columbus, Ohio, in early June of 2022. Placed eighth in the 400 meters and won the 100-, 200- and 400-meter dashes in blustery conditions at the 89th Mansfield Mehock Relays, pulling the rare triple for just the third time since the meet went metric in 1979.

Maurice Ware competed in the high jump during the OHSAA State Track Meet at Ohio State University's Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium in Columbus, Ohio, in early June of 2022. Maurice finished as state runner-up with a jump of 6'8, Cleared 6-0 for one of the highest jumps and finished tied for first place at the Mehock Relays. Cleared 6-4 at the Bill Krause Invitational in Tiffin, coming in first.

Amil Upchurch competed in the high jump during the OHSAA State Track Meet at Ohio State University's Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium in Columbus, Ohio, in early June of 2022. Placed seventh, with his best jump of 6-6. Cleared 6-0 for one of the highest jumps and finished tied for first place at the Mehock Relays. Cleared 6-4 at the Bill Krause Invitational in Tiffin, coming in second.

Resource Solutions- Safety Consultants, Sandy Hovest and Rick Evans

Sandy Hovest and Rick Evans gave a report of this year's Safety initiatives and progress. The district Safety Team has Refined evacuation procedures and locations completed Safety plan updates for all buildings and they are finishing up Arlin Field. Our internal teams have partnered with EMA, police, fire, hospitals and public health with the primary goal for awareness and collaboration. Planning to have a multi-disciplinary team in each building with training beginning October 21, 2022. Safety inspections will be completed throughout the year including all buildings, labs, and key area.

<u>Gear Up</u> – Nikia Fletcher introduced Effie James who gave an overview of the GEAR Up program.

The Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (**GEAR UP**) is a federal grant administered by the Ohio Department of Higher Education. The GEAR UP Ohio project is focused on embedding a college-going culture in targeted schools and communities. The project aims to increase academic performance, postsecondary preparation and enrollment, and awareness of financial and professional options for those students and their families. MCS is partnered with College Now Greater Cleveland.

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<u>Tiny House</u> – Nikia Fletcher introduced Greg Morris the Career Tech's construction trades instructor who took the Board and those attending on a tour through the Tiny House, built by Mansfield Sr. High Construction Trades students.
