The people on the Western Wind-Up staff went to visit the News-Journal. It was very interesting. These are the rooms we visited and the ones the newspaper goes through before it is delivered to your house the turkeys in the woods.

The first part of the building that we went through was the editor in the woods when he heard the ial room. The guide showed us the desks where the different editors

sat.

The next room had six automatic typewriters which were typeing but the news that came in over the wire from other cities:

the articles in the proper columns and pages. To us the lead plates looked upside down and backwards. . We watched a man at work at

the line type machine. He typed a line at a time in lead form.

In the engraving room the comics were made. These were in sheets of composition mats with the designs imprinted on them. They put these in a small machine and poured hot lead over them so they had the pictures on a lead plate.

The photographing room had a large camera. We learned that the pictures we see in the paper are hade up of many little dats. Where it is dark the dots are close together and where it is light they

are far apart.

The last room was the large bress room where the papers are printed: The printing press turns the papers out all printed and fold that it was the best party that ed, ready to be delivered to you. The press prints 20,000 papers an hour or 333 papers a minute.


