The school orchestra is directed by Mr. S.K. Jorgensen. Each Friday afternoon at 2:30, Jorgensen comes to the school.

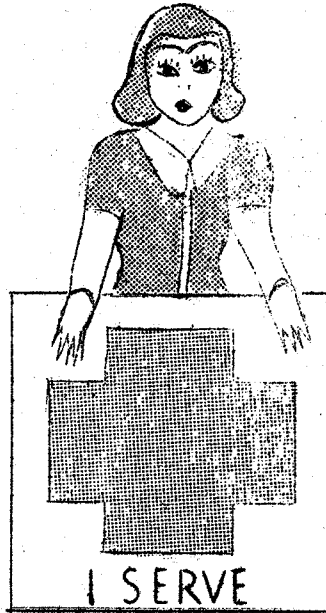
The orchestra is divided into two parts, the wood wind and brass instruments and the string instruments. Both groups go to the music room at different times.

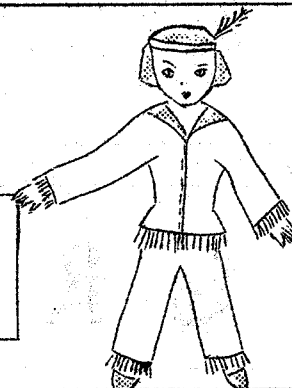

"KEEPING THE LAWN NEAT"

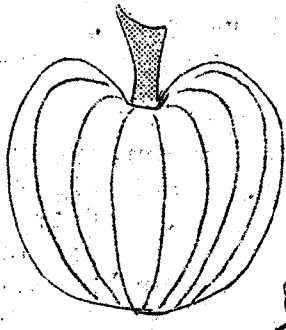

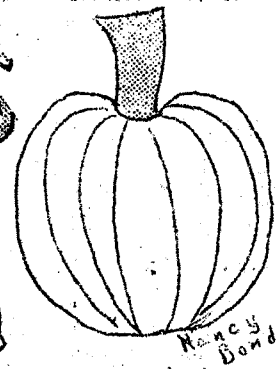
"FIRE DRILLS"

"THANKSGIVING VACATION"

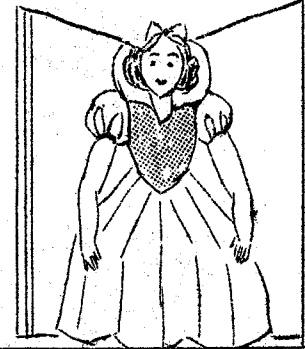
School will be out Wednesday, Nov. 23, at 3:35 for Thanksgiving vacation. It will take up again Monday, Nov. 28, at 8:30.

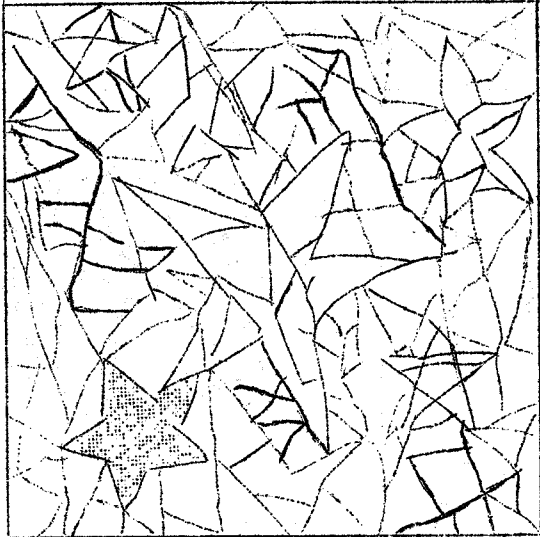

"SAFETY CLUB"

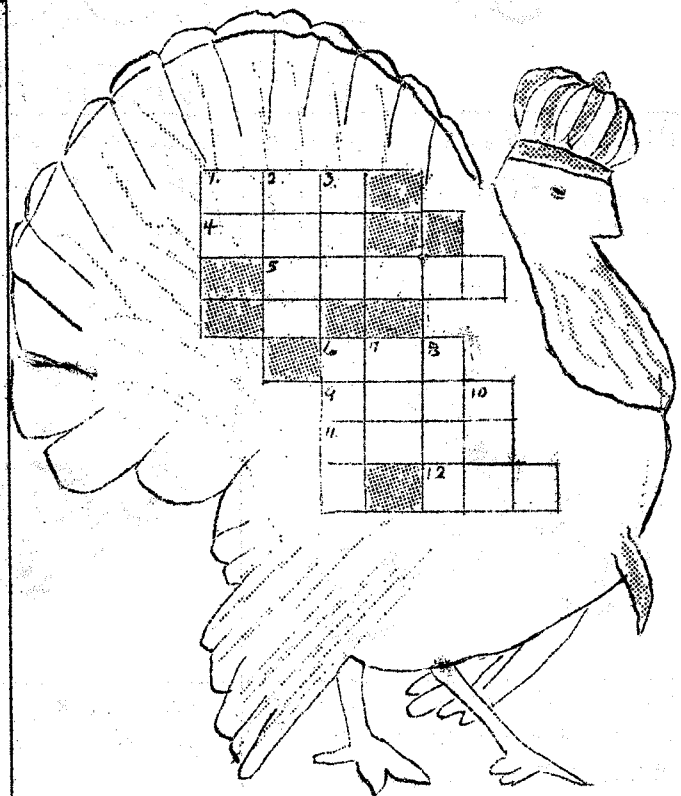
The rooms of Western Ave. school have organized a Safety Club. Officers and representatives were chosen from each room to have one meeting a month.

"STAR STUDY"

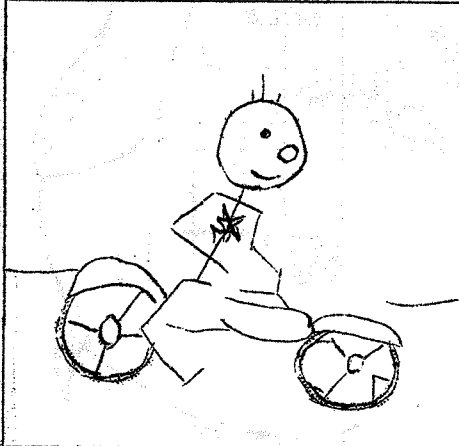

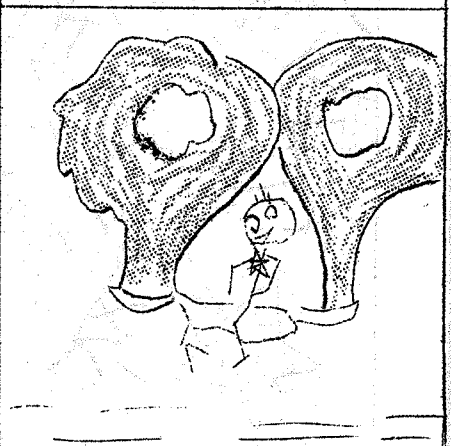

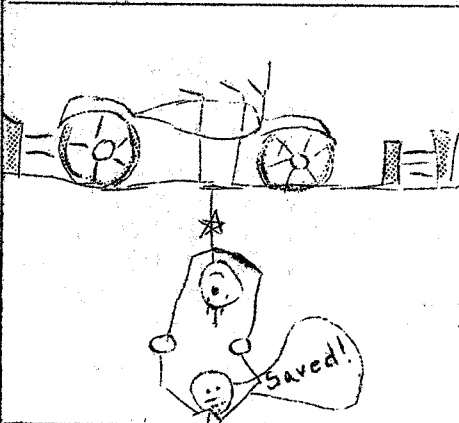

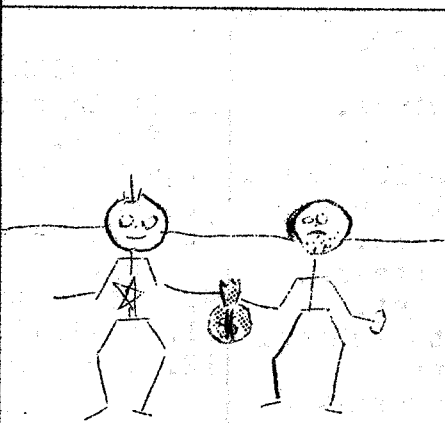

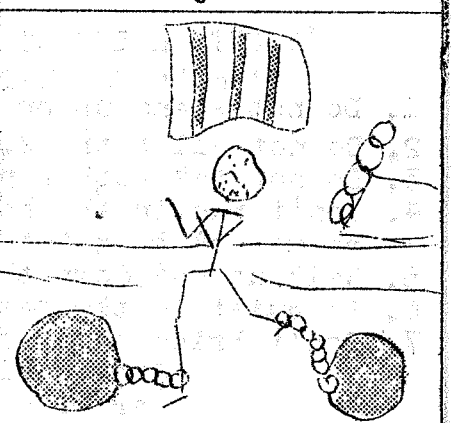

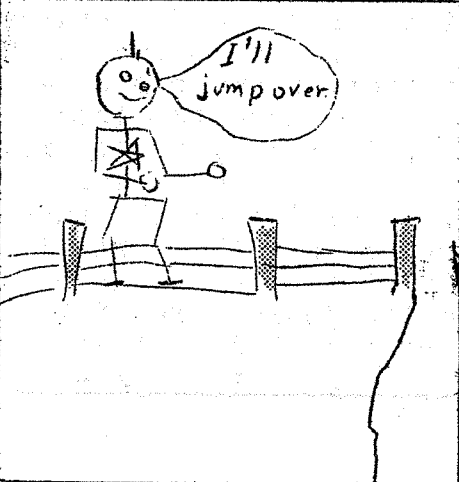

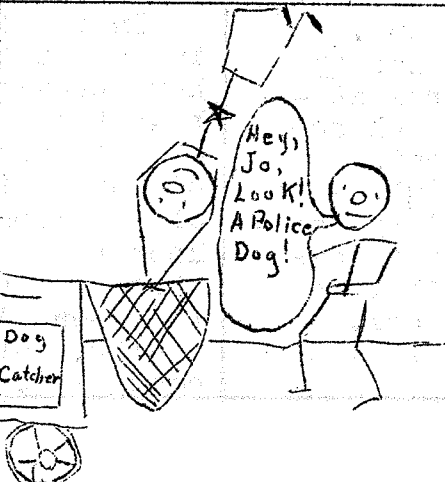
