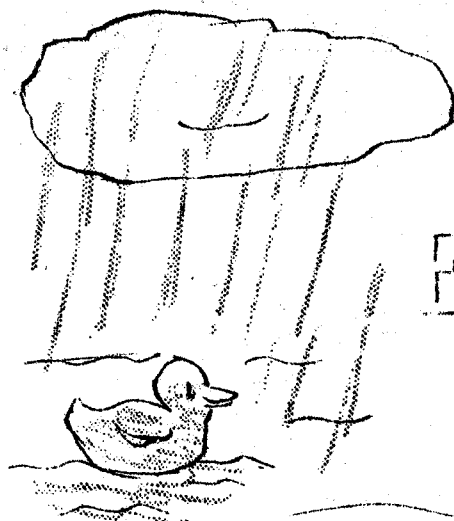

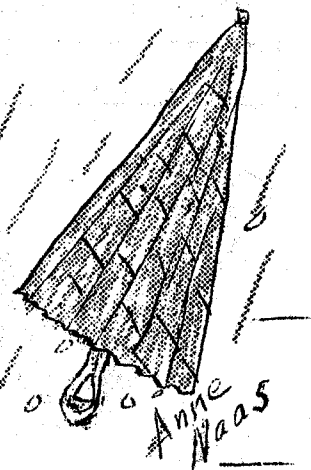

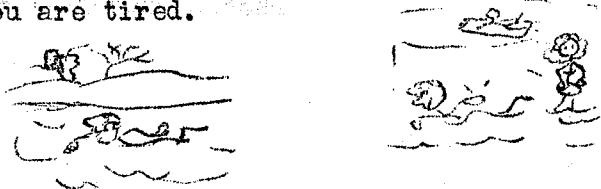

SWIMMING -- DO learn to swim. Always swim with someone. Remember your own ability and start back before you are tired.



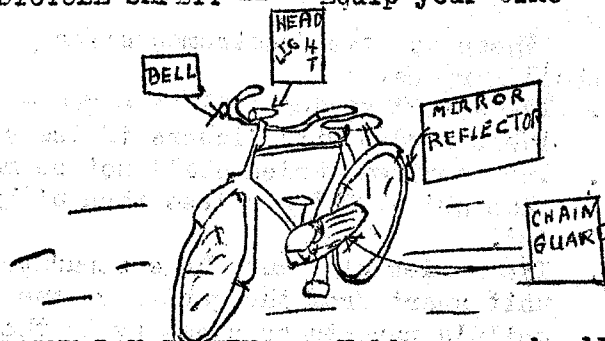
HIKING -- DO wear protective clothing when going through tall grass to keep ticks from attaching themselves to your skin. Boots and heavy leggings in snake country are important.

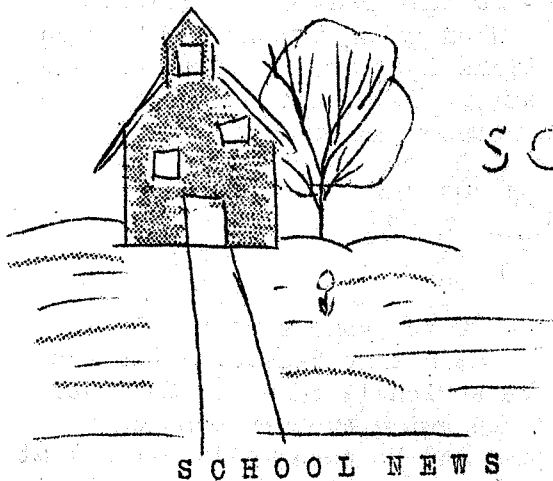


BICYCLE SAFETY -- Equip your bike -

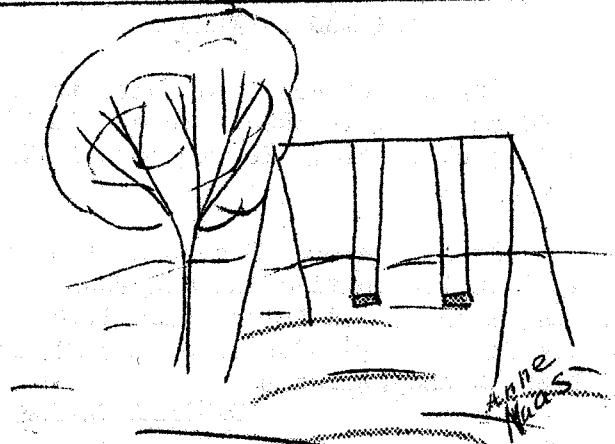


RAINY DAY SAFETY -- Hold your umbrella so you have good vision.

SCHOOL GARDENS

Every year there's a school garden contest. If your parents say you can have a garden entered in the contest, you fill out a blank given to you from your teacher and return it to her.

These are the Requirements for school gardens:

1. The school garden will be a vegetable garden with flowers if desired.
2. The combined garden shall not be more than 20' by 25' nor less than 5' by 12'.
3. The garden plot must be a separate unit apart from the garden of the child's parents or close by in the neighborhood.
4. The garden shall be the project of the contestant. That is, all the work should be done by the child (except spading by little children).
5. Any extra produce should be canned or sold to prevent waste.
6. A plan of your garden should be made and presented to the judges.

The prizes are:

1. A tree to the school having the highest increase in (a) Enrollment; (b) Completed gardens; (c) Highest average score made by the children.
2. \$1.00 prize to those with the winning gardens.
3. \$.50 to those whose gardens are satisfactory.
4. All children will receive a certificate if they complete their garden.

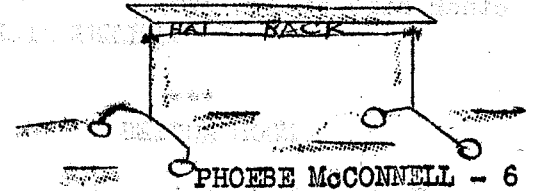
NEW COAT RACKS

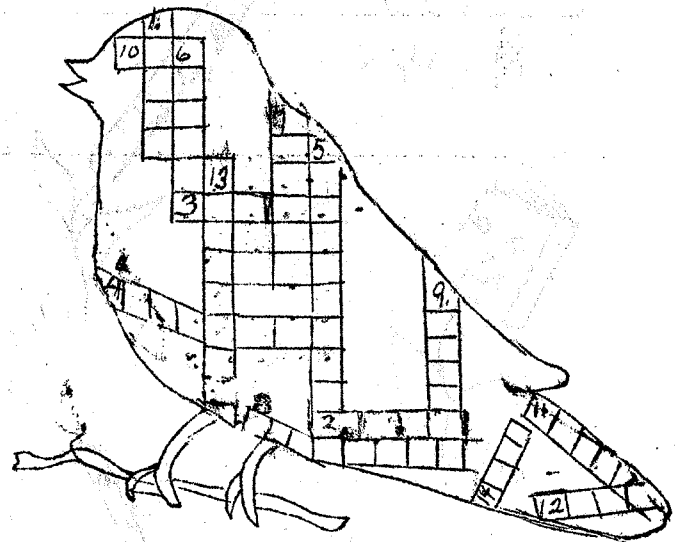

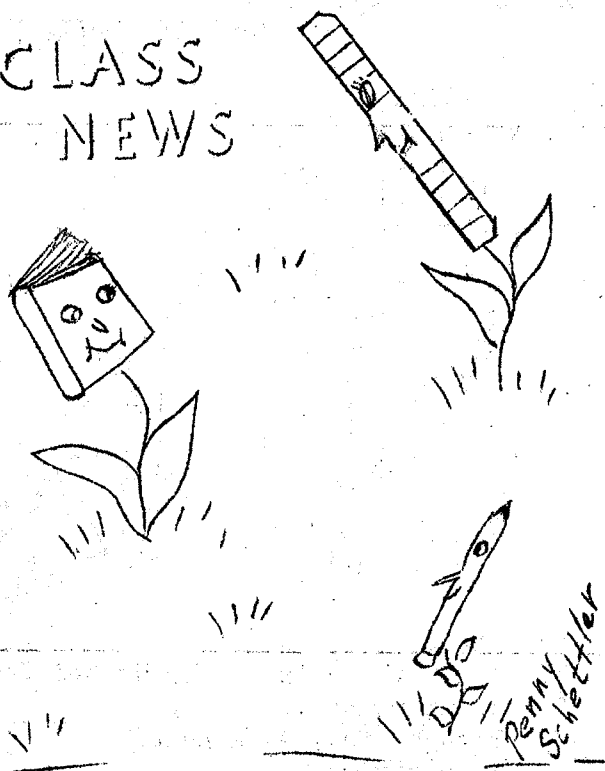

MRS. SHERMAN'S ROOM

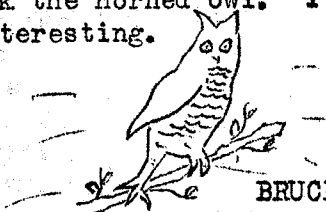
Bird Study

Our room wove Indian Mats. We used paper of two different colors that looked nice together.

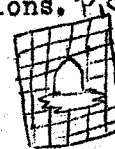
After they were woven, we had to think of a use for them. Some made Easter baskets, pictures and book covers. They make very nice decorations.

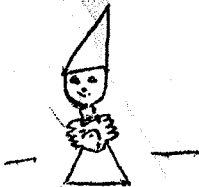
Our Puppets

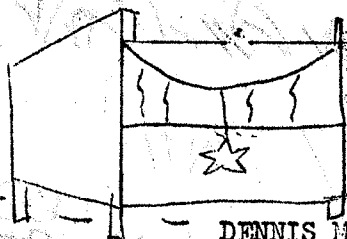

One day we were talking about having a puppet show so we asked Mr. Clark if we could. He said that we could have it. He remembered the old stage that the building had. He let us use it for our stage.

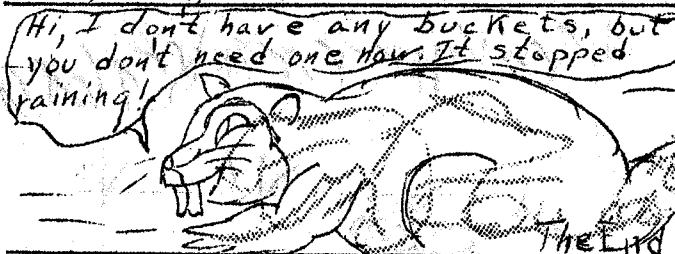
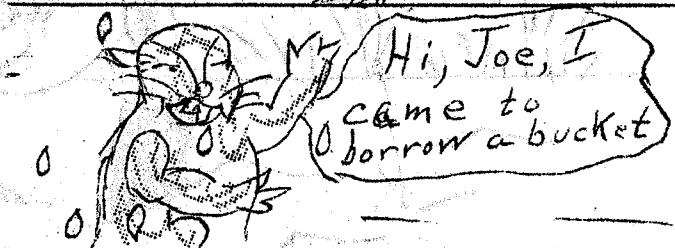
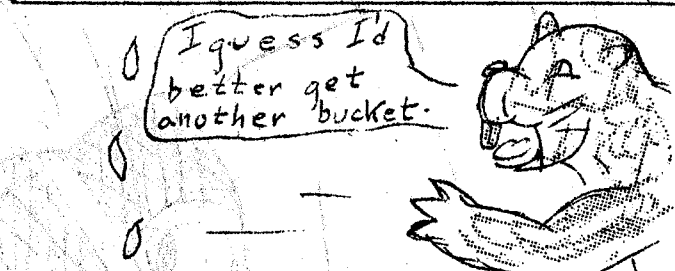

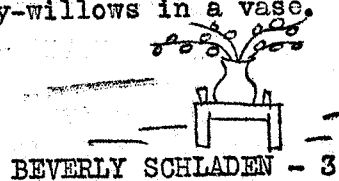
Cotton Bunnies
