


EASTER

Easter is a Christian festival which honors Christ when he rose from the dead. Easter gets it's name from a Anglo-Saxon goddess.


In most Christian churches, Easter marks the end of forty-day observance of Lent season.

This year they won second prize.




- cup shortening 1/8 teas. soda
