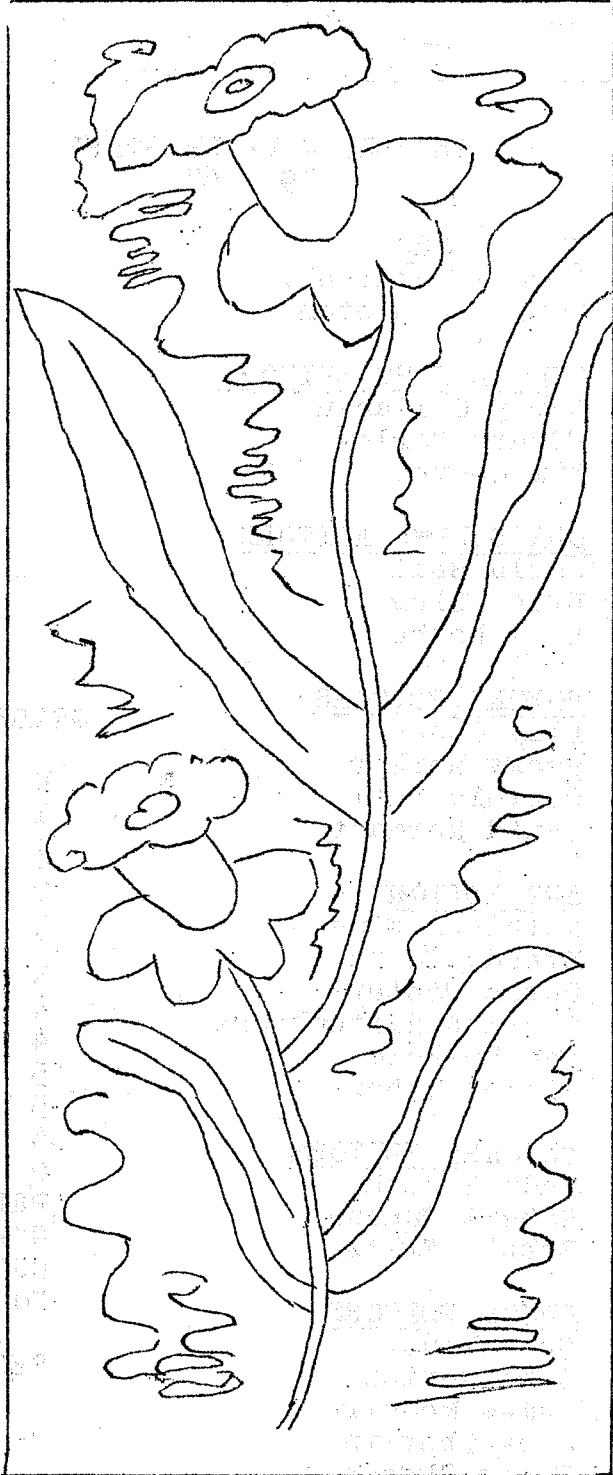
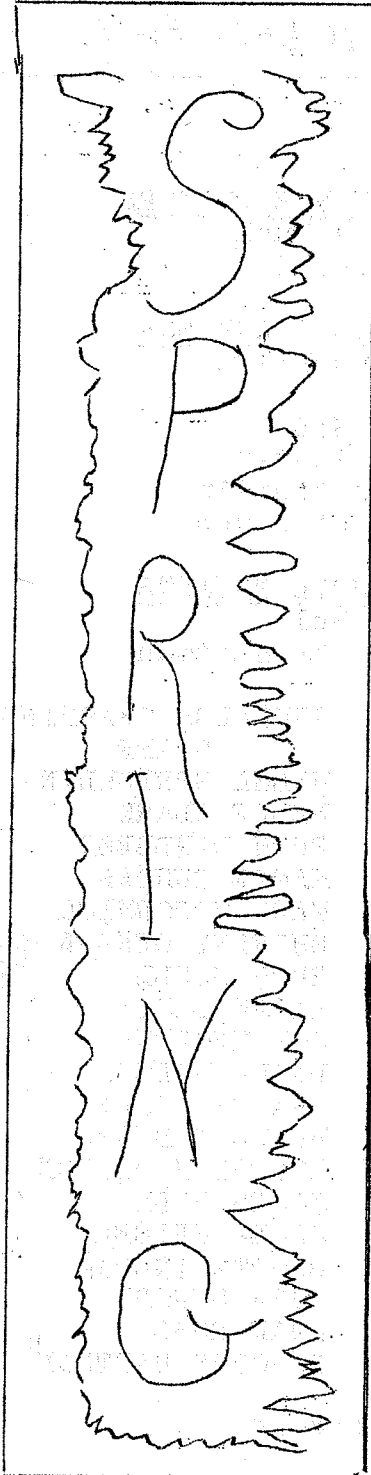

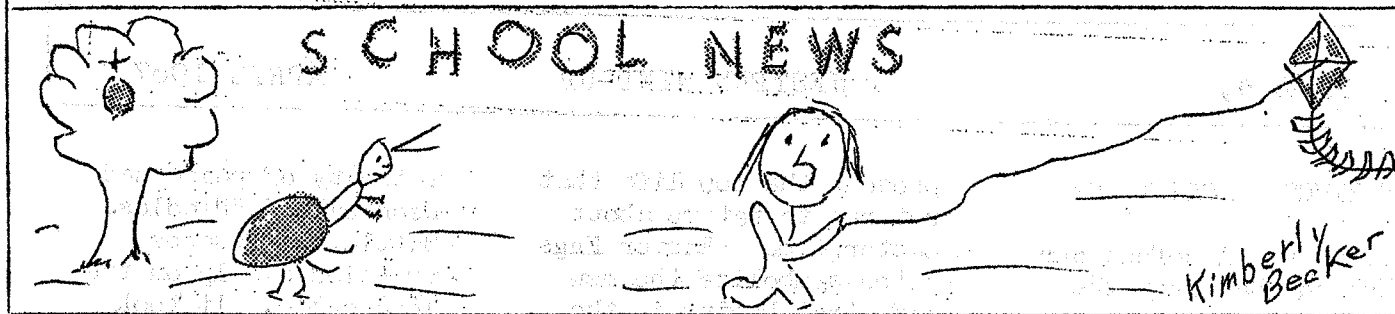

The size of an ant is about an eighth of an inch in length to a full inch or more.

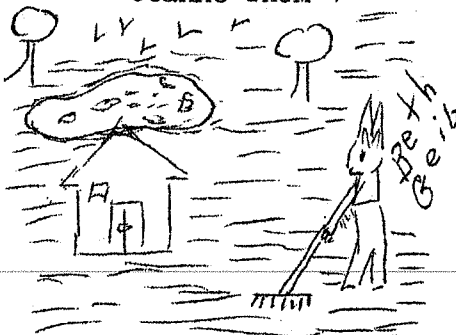
A group of ants living together is called a colony.

BATS

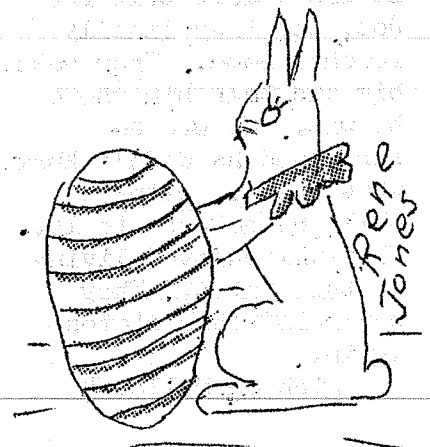
Many people are afraid of all bats but they should not be. The only bats known to harm people are the vampire bats of South America. These bats live on blood. Most bats are tiny creatures. Our common little brown bat weighs only about as much as a nickel. The bat called the flying fox which lives in the tropics has a wingspread of five feet. Bats fly, but they are not birds. They are mammals instead. They have fur, and they feed their babies milk. The wings of a bat are made of tough skin. The skin is stretched from the animals "arms" and long fingers to its hind legs and tail. Bats are swift and expert flyers. Even in the dark a bat can fly about without bumping into anything. It has a kind of sonar system. As it flies it makes sounds that are too high-pitches for us to hear. These sounds are echoed by anything in the way. The bats big ears catch the echoes. The bat then flies in another direction.

ALASKA REPORTS

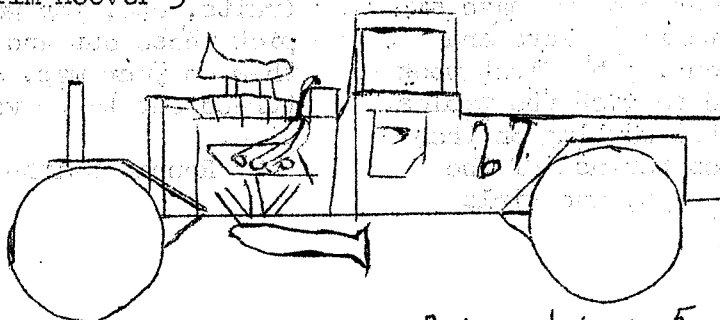

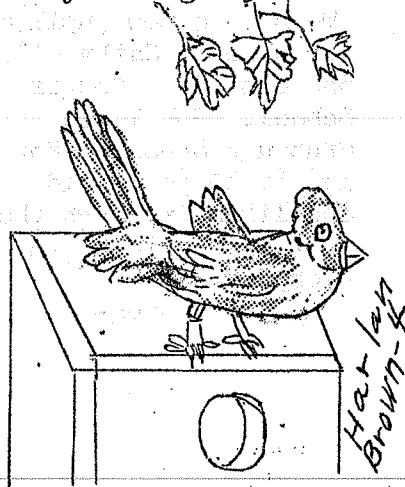

The damage was estimated at least one half million dollars.

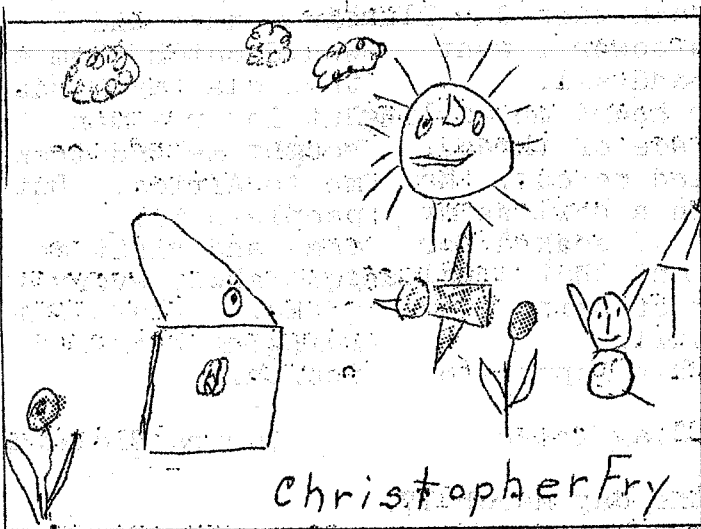

Seventy fireman were at work trying to save the houses around the coliseum.

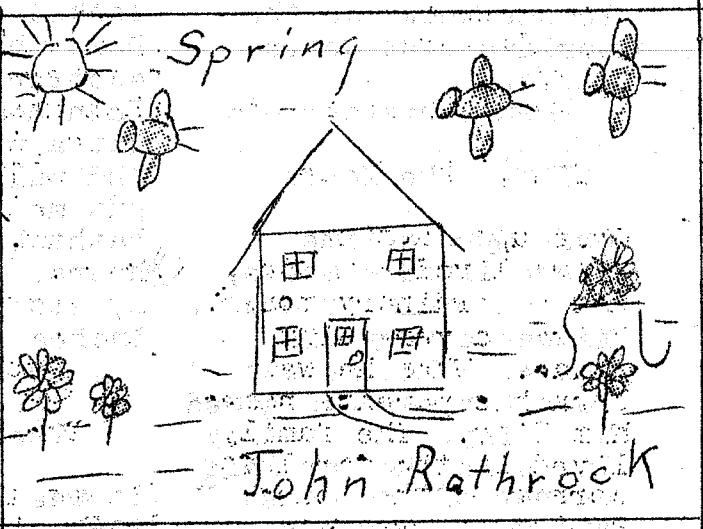
