ginger. Cook over low

ually add liquid,  
stirring constantly to  
boiling point. Cook  
over low heat 10 min-  
utes. Makes 1 3/4  
cups.

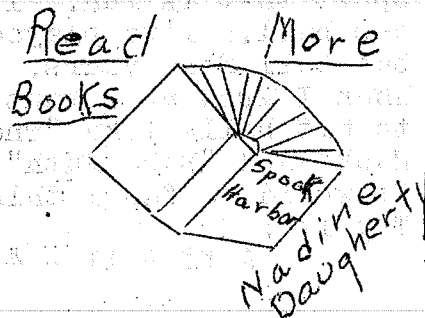
## SCHOOL PICTURES
