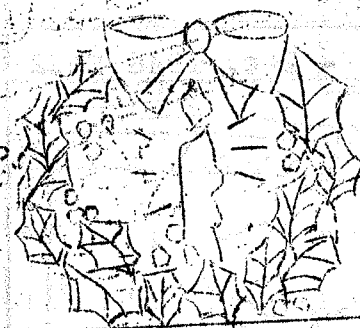

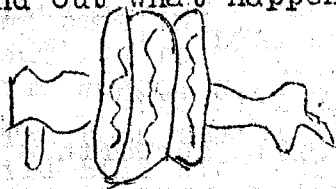
Wild Bill Hickock

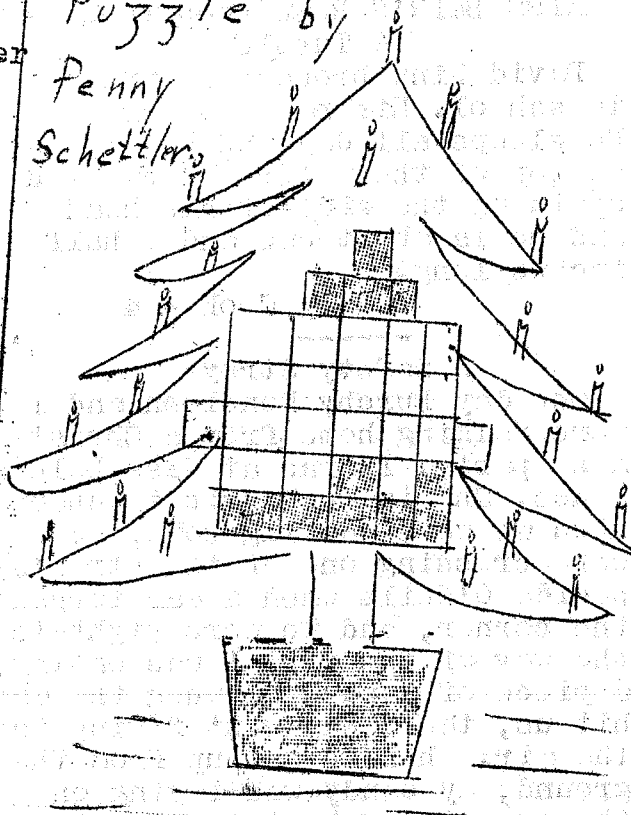

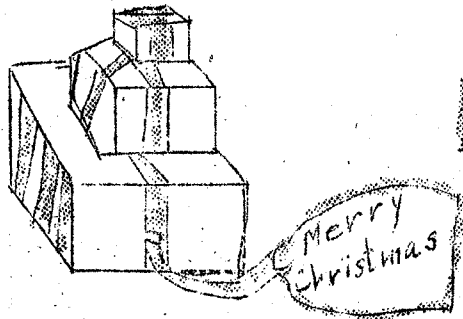

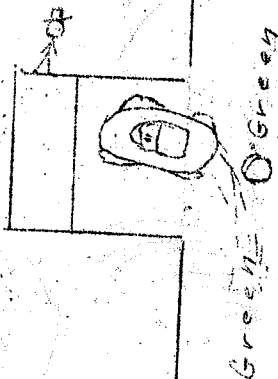
The part I liked best was when

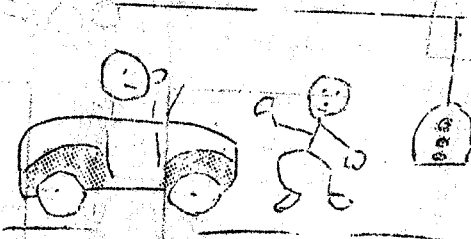
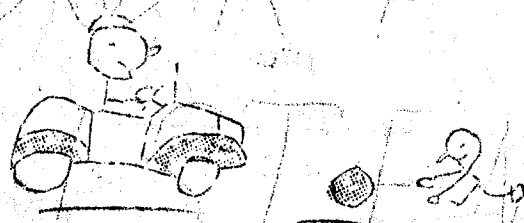

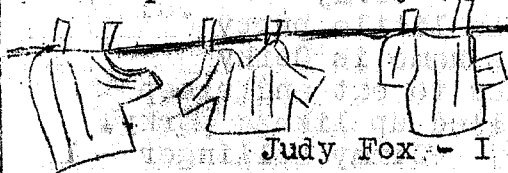
Class News

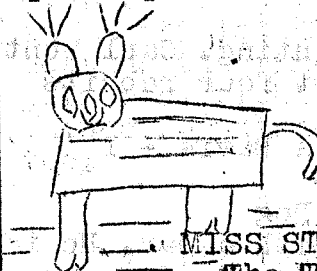

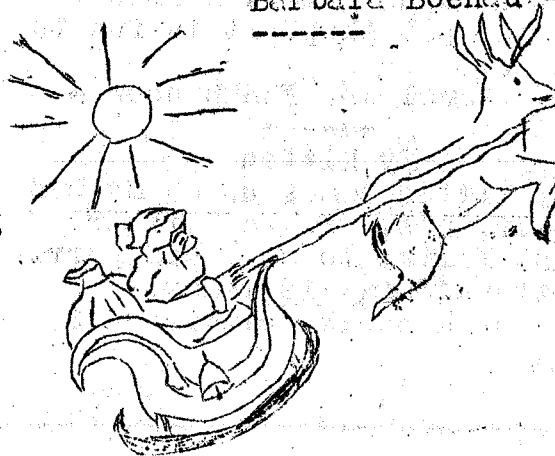

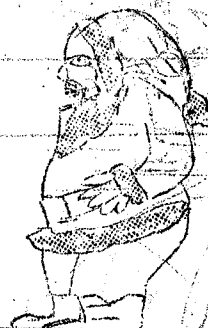
