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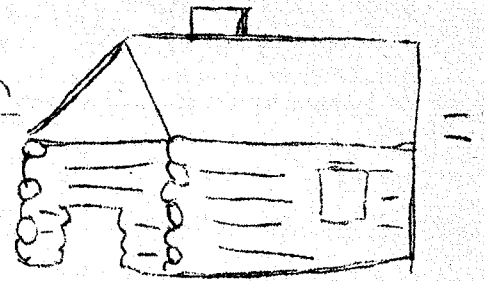

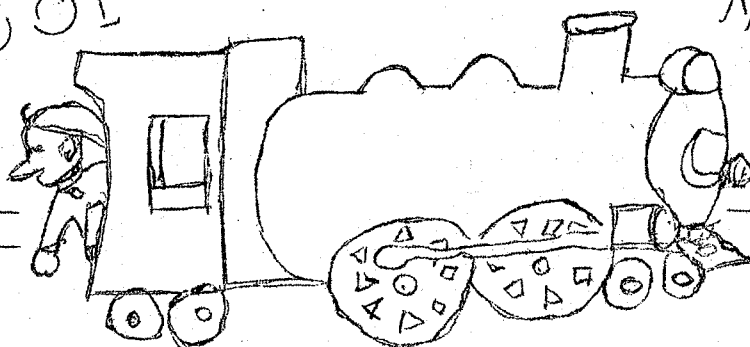
If items that are turned in are not claimed by the owner they are sent to place's such as the Friendly House.
