The third chart was the roughage foods. It consists of potatoes and other vegetables and fruits.

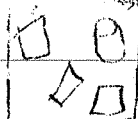
The fourth chart was milk and milk products. Some of these things are milk, cheese and cream.

Then we colored in the mountains, lowlands, uplands, and the North Sea, Irish Sea, and the Atlantic Ocean. They are all on the bulletin board.

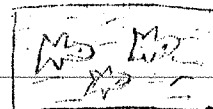

In Mrs. Sherman's sixth grade we have an aquarium.

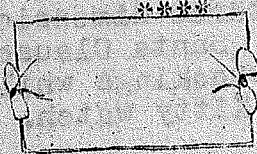

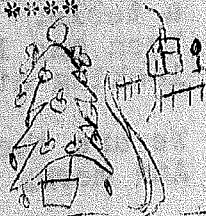

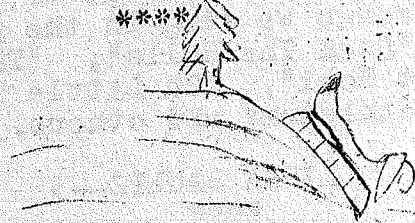


WINTER FUN

LUNCHROOM PAINTINGS

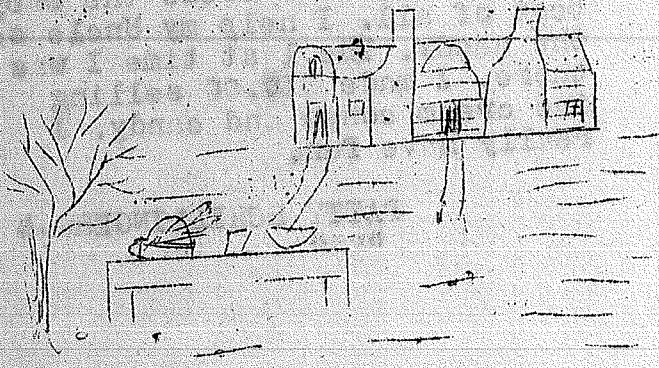
Some of the children in our class painted a scene on the lunchroom windows. They painted a turkey with pilgrims and Indians dancing around the turkey.

At the back of our room there is a Library table.

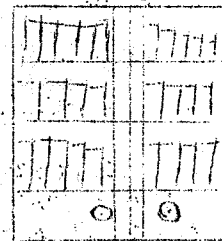
On this table are books and magazines which do not have cards. In free time the children may go back to the table and read quietly to themselves. The books are very interesting and I am sure you would enjoy them.

MY THANKSGIVING VACATION

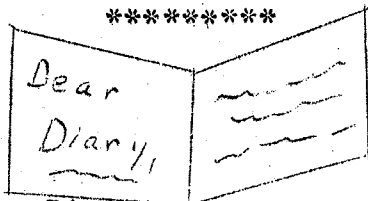

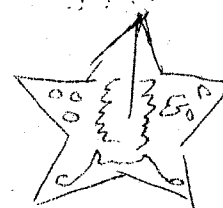


Stars for Tree or Table Decoration
