



DECEMBER


CHRISTMAS AT THE TOMTEN'S FARM

Bake at 375° for 8 minutes. Makes about 3 dozen cookies. Sift together: 13/4 cups flour. 1 teaspoon soda 🗦 teaspoon salt Cream together: $\frac{1}{2}$ cup shortening-1 cup peanut butter. Gradually add 1/2 cup sugar and ½ cup firmly packed brown sugar, creamwell. Add 1 unbeaten egg 2 tbls. milk and 1 teas. vanilla. Beat well. Blend in shape the dry ingredients gradually; mix thoroughly by rounded teaspoonfuls into balls. Roll in sugar place on ungreased cookie sheets. Bake at 3750 for 8 minutes. Remove from oven and place a solid milk chocolate candy kiss on top of each cookie, pressing down so that cookies crack around edge. Return to oven; bake 2 to 5 minutes longer. Have a nice Christmas.

rootbeer, or favorite flavor hard candy, crushed. Food coloring (optional) Light Corn syrup Colored sugar or candy

Heat oven to 375°

In large bowl, mix butter, sugar, egg and vanilla. Blend in flour, soda and cream of tartar on low speed to soft dough, scraping bowl constantly. Work candy into dough; mix in food coloring.

If desired, chill dough 1 to 2 hours for easier handling.

Roll dough # inch thick on lightly floured clothcovered board. Cut with 2 round or 3 shaped cookie cutters. Place on ungreased baking sheet carefully. Insert 6" skewer through each cookie.

Bake 6 to 8 minutes or lightly browned. Cool slightly before removing from baking sheet. Cool thoroughly; brush corn syrup in pattern. Sprinkle with colored sugar. Makes about 40 cookie pops.




