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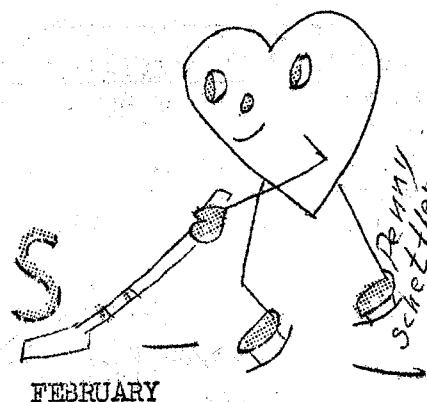
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February is now the second month of the year. On the old Roman Calendar, it was the last month of the year.

GEORGE WASHINGTON

In 1836, Lincoln got a license to practice law. Lincoln was a good lawyer.

On November 4, 1842, Abraham Lincoln married a girl named Mary Todd.

March 4, 1861, he was inaugurated president of the United States.

While attending a performance at the Ford Theatre, John Wilkes Booth, one of the actors, shot Lincoln. At 7:22 o'clock on the morning of April 15, 1865, Abraham Lincoln died.

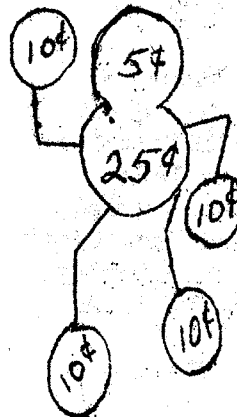
GROUND HOG DAY

There were 250 pounds of turkey.

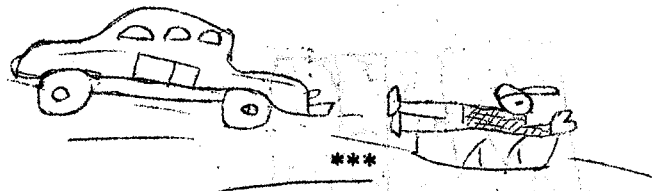

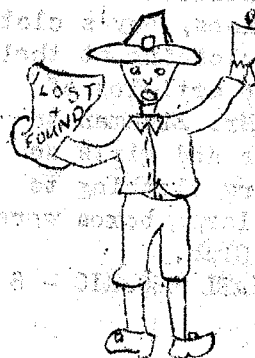

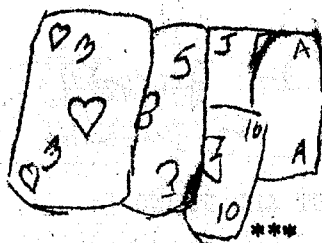


BENEFIT BRIDGE AND STYLE SHOW

When the scientist was burning the mineral, smoke would come out of the top of Skull Mountain.

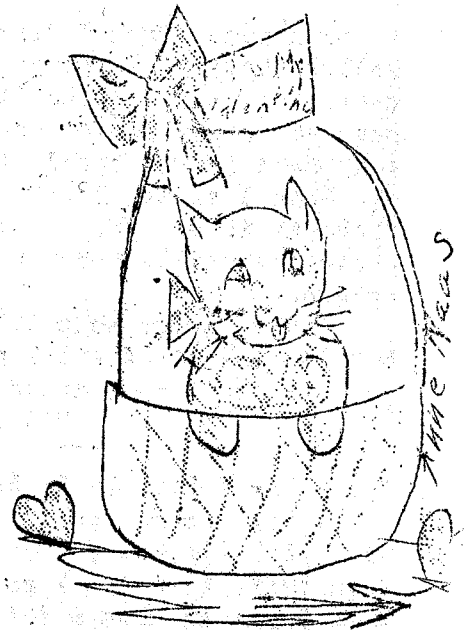

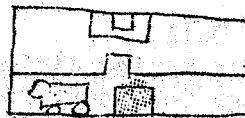

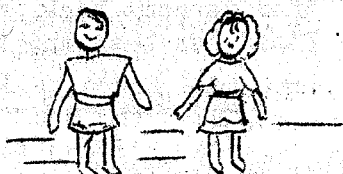
If you know how to skate, you can have a lot of fun when it is frozen good enough to skate on. I hope you get to go ice skating this year sometime.

Our Trip to Florida

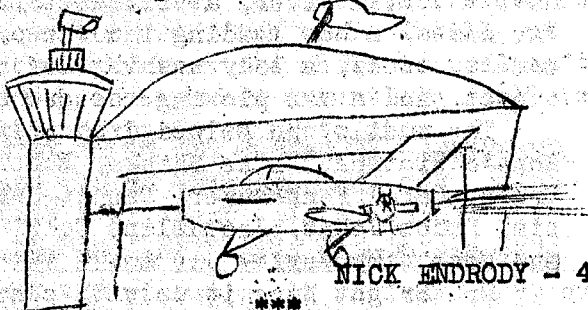
