## Mothers Club News

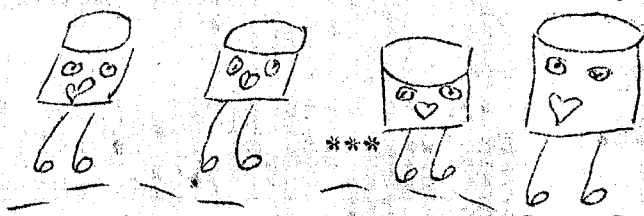
The Ways and Means Committee of the Rebecca Grubaugh Mothers Club is planning a cake walk Feb. 18, at Grubaugh school.

### Thomas Alva Edison

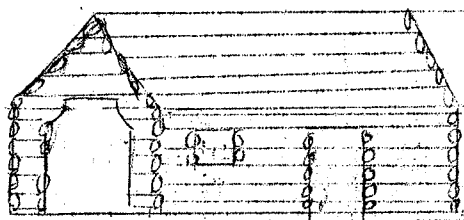
He was born 108 years ago in year of 1847. He is one of the world's greatest inventors. He lacked formal education, attended school only three months. His desire for education was so great he read many scientific books. At 15, he was printing and editing a small paper of his own. He learned telegraphy and in 1864 invented an automatic telegraph repeater. During the next few years he devised stock tickers, telegraph systems and the electric pen which developed into the mimeograph. He established a manufacturing plant at Newark N.J. which he gave up afterward in order to devote himself wholly to invention. In 1877, Edison made application for a patent on a phonograph or speaking machine. Edison has taken out more than 1000 patents besides having originated hundreds of minor devices.

Among the most notable of his achievements are the phonograph, the incandescent electric lamp, long distance transmission telephone, megaphone, aerophone, duplex telegraphic system and the nickeliron storage cell. These and many others are the inventions given to us by Thomas A. Edison.

We all tried very hard to get two black squares. Sometimes we get one black square. We all hope that we get across the chart first.

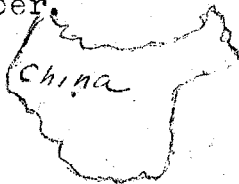

### Our Study of Greece

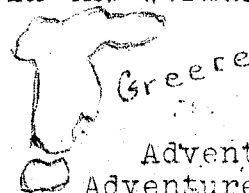
