




THOMAS ALVA EDISON

Thomas A. Edison (1847-1931) is generally recognized as the greatest inventor in history because his inventions have had so great an effect on our lives.

His electric light bulb, phonograph, the motion picture machine became known in every inhabited part of the earth.

His success as an inventor started during the Reconstruction period that followed the war between the States. This was an especially favorable time for his inventions. The theory of electricity had been developed enough to make people realize that it could be useful. There was a need for mechanical improvements. During that period industry and commerce had plenty of resources and money to put into new ventures.

"HONEST ABE" LINCOLN.

Lincoln was born on February 12, 1809, in what is now Hodgesville, Kentucky. In 1813, he moved to Knob Creek, Kentucky. He had to split logs, plant corn, and pumpkins when he was only 10 years old.

This poem was found in his copy book:

Abraham Lincoln, his hand and pen
He will be good, but God knows
when.

At 22, he ran a ferry boat. He was very delighted when he earned a dollar. Once he worked in a store and he short changed a woman. He walked 11 miles to give the woman her right change. That is how he got his nickname "Honest Abe". Soon after, the store went bankrupt.

Lincoln had no place to go so he studied to be a lawyer. He was in love with Ann Rutledge but she died, he was very sad. After that he married Mary Todd.

In 1860, he was elected president. Lincoln tried desperately to keep the slavery issue from splitting the country but on April 12, 1861, southern troops took Fort Sumter. In 1863, Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation. Months later in Gettysburg he gave his Gettysburg Address.

One evening he went to the Ford Theater. He was sitting in a box when John Wilkes Booth shot him. The next day he died. Everyone was sad at his death.


A STORY OF GEORGE WASHINGTON



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


PRODUCT MAPS




FOLDERS OF CANADA

SALT MAPS


In Mrs. Sherman's room we are making salt maps. The maps are of South America.

WORLD NEWS MAP


Every week we have a World News Map.

road station to see my Aunt and Uncle off for California. I ate my breakfast quickly.


