



Then we type all of the articles and arrange them on paper according to their subject.


We draw the front cover and primary page on a stencil.
Mrs. Richard types the articles on the stencils.


Then we take the stencils to the stock room and put one on the mimeograph machine. We add paper and ink runs through the stencil.


After we are finished with the printing we put all of the papers on the table arranged in order.





Bring a magnetic compass close to your radiator at home or at school. Place the compass at the top er of the radiator and the north end of the needle will point to it. Place the compass at the lower end of the radiator and the needle will swing away from it. This shows that the radiator has two different poles and is therefor a magnet.

If you go through the house testing dil ferent iron objects you will become more and more excited at the number of weak magnets you have around you. You probably learned that iron objects become magnetized when they are near magnets. In this case, the earth is a magnet. You will find that in order for these iron objects to have different poles on the too and bottom they must have been in one position for some time.

In this way the iron in them is lined up in the earth's magnetic fiela. You can, devise many experiments Like all donkeys he that may occur to you. was stubborn.
