





BENJAMIN FRANKLIN Early Life



Franklin led all the men of his time in his lifelong concern for the happiness, well-being and dignity of mankind.



The Wind-Up now has 20 to 28 pages. Our P.T.A. provides the paper and stencils for it. We appreciate and are grateful to the P.T.A for this.




2g cups of water l cup corn meal 3/4 teaspoon salt


