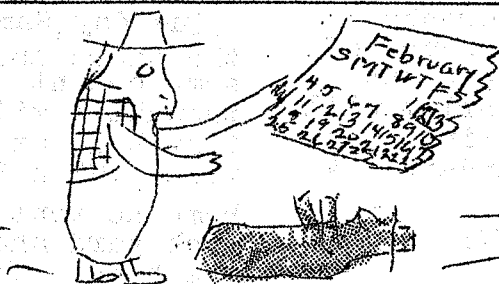
When he was seven years old his family moved to Port Huron, Michigan where he entered a public school. His teacher

At the age of twelve Edison peddled newspapers on the Grand Trunk Railway thus beginning to make his own way in the world. On his first trip to Detroit he visited the public library and was deeply impressed by the rows and rows of books. If he read all of the books there he reasoned, he would know almost everything in the world. Measuring off the shelves, he decided to read a foot of books every week. Edison bought equipment for experimenting with the money earned on the train.

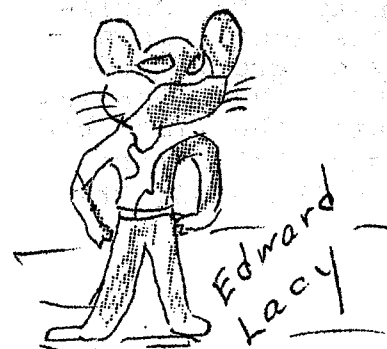

## HORSES

A horse can run swiftly because of its slim legs. The powerful hind legs are the ones that carry the horse. Because of the horse's eyes he can see forward, sideways, and a little backwards because of its oval shaped eyes. Many horses have sharp hearing. They often neigh, which means make a loud prolonged cry to another horse when they are far apart.

Male horses have 40 teeth, females have 36. The horse teeth have no nerves and they never stop growing.

There are ten leading horse states. These are Texas, Kentucky, Missouri, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Nebraska, Iowa, Tennessee, Illinois.

When a horse falls and breaks its leg it is usually destroyed. It is done to keep the horse from suffering. The tail of a horse is for shooing away flies or other annoying insects.

The riding equipment of a horse is

neck strap, curb reins, noseband, cheekpiece and many other things.

Horses have good memories. For example, if a colt is frightened it will not forget what happened. Years later if a similar thing happens, the adult horse will be frightened.

If I had a choice between all the horses in the world I would probably pick the Palamino. My hobby is horses. I like to ride them. Palomina is a great horse and is very smart.

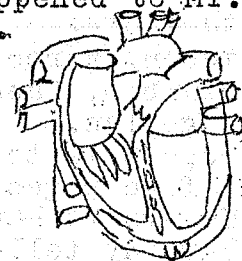
