

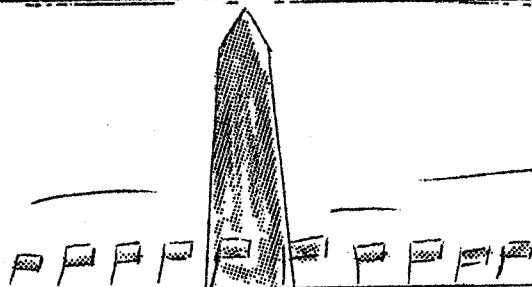

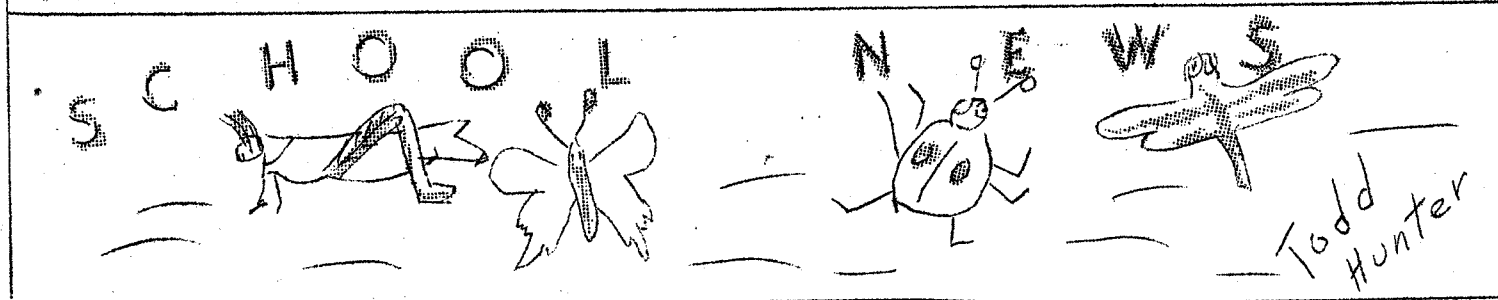

## FAMOUS PEOPLE

THOMAS ALVA EDISON  
(1847-1931)

Edison was a great inventor. He was born Feb. 11, 1847 at Milan, Ohio. He was the seventh and youngest child of Samuel and Nancy Elliot Edison.

At the age of 7, Alva moved with his parents to Huron, Michigan, where his father started a grain and lumber business. When he was 12, he got a job as a news butcher where he sold sandwiches and newspapers and peanuts and candy on a train that ran between Port Huron and Detroit. In his spare time he experimented with chemicals in the baggage car. He became deaf when he was trying to climb aboard. A conductor pulled his ear and got him up on the platform. Edison never became completely deaf. He didn't mind being deaf. He said it helped him concentrate more.

In 1887, Edison moved to a larger and more modern laboratory in West Orange, N. J. Back in 1914 Edison connected the phonograph and camera to make talking pictures. The machine showed some faults and he put it aside and some other men improved it. He died at the age of 84 on Oct. 18, 1931.
