Abraham Lincoln was born on February 12, 1809, on a farm near where Hodgenville, Ky. stands today. They lived there for two years. They moved to a farm on Knob Creek ten miles away. They stayed there till Abe was seven years old. Abe did the work of a boy his age, he spent a little time in school. In 1816 they decided to move to Indiana. Life was a lot harder than in Kentucky. They arrived in the middle of winter. They couldn't set up a cabin so they set up a half face cabin. A face cabin is built of logs and poles, and has only three sides. On the fourth side is a blazing fire.

But today he's one of the world's truly great men. People then and now still call him Honest Abe and Father Abraham.

Lincoln died April 14, 1865, in the Ford's Theatre in Washington. He was killed by an actor, John Wilkes Booth. Millions of people were in sorrow because of his death.

Today we still remember him as Honest Abe.

Many southern colonists lived on large farms called plantations. Near the stately home of the owner, stood the cabins of the slaves and the shops of plantation craftsmen.

Fields of crops often stretched for miles beyond these buildings.

New England colonists prayed and read the Bible in their homes. On Sunday, they attended Church services in the morning, as well as in the afternoon. People who lived far from town brought their lunches. Villages were built near good harbors along the New England coast. Many of the colonists who lived in these villages worked as fishermen or sailors.

In 1647, Public schools were started in New England. Schools in the Dutch Colony of New Netherland were established by the church. In the southern colonies, there were almost no schools.

Early colonists made their own candles by dipping wicks into melted tallow. After each dipping the tallow was set to cool. The wicks were dipped again and again until the candles were thick enough.

A colonial housewife wove cloth on a wooden hand loom. The "heddles"

on the loom separated the lengthwise threads into two groups, crosswise threads were slipped between these two groups. The "latten" pushed the crosswise threads into place.
