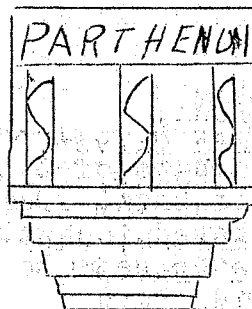
MRS. SHERMAN'S ROOM

Mrs. Sherman's sixth grade had started to make animals. First we

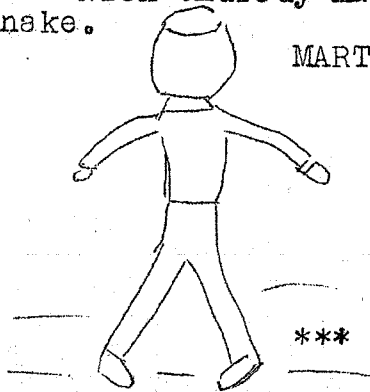

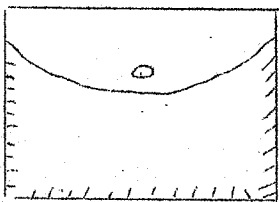


Leather Projects

shooting for baskets.

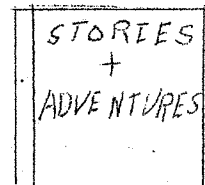

the Public Library.

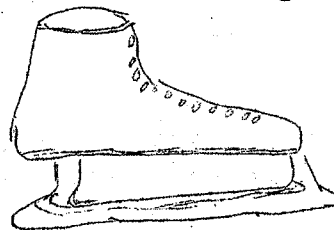

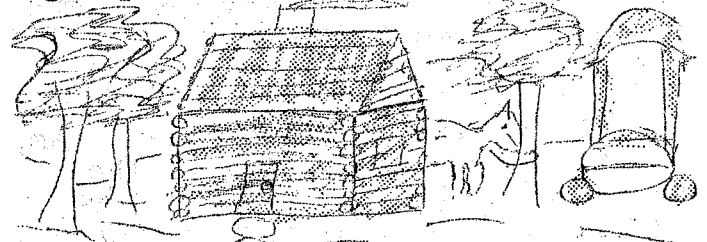
In history we made log cabins.

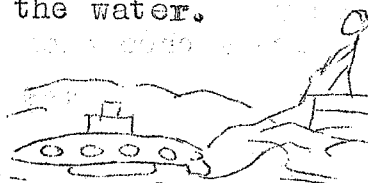
My Dog

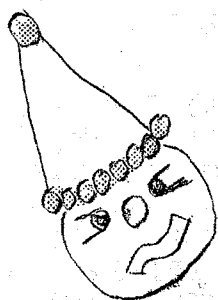

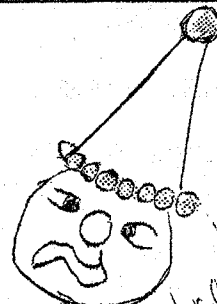

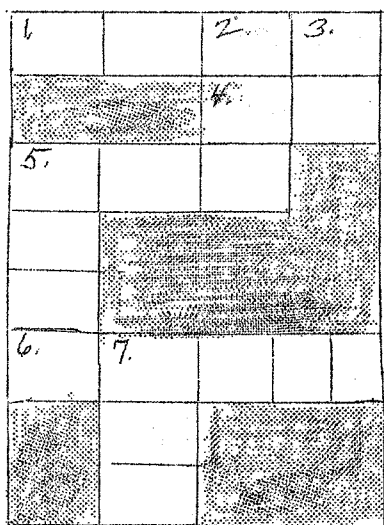
