OUR NEWS JOURNAL TRIP

Miss Miles' fifth grade went to the News Journal May 14. Each one of us was to act as a reporter finding out as many interesting facts about Mansfield's newspaper as we could. We each took a notebook and pencil so we could write down what we learned in an outline. This is what I learned from the trip.

When you enter the building from the front entrance you find yourself in the lobby. On the right of you is the classified advertising department, where anyone can go with personal adds for the paper. And on the left is the display advertising department, which is for adds that the stores and companies put in. There are around fifteen people in each of the advertising departments.

We then went to the press room to see how the press worked. The only way I can describe the press is "big and noisy." This huge press uses about six tons of paper a day, and prints 4,000 newspapers an hour. Fifty to one-hundred gallons of ink are used each day.

There are two editions of the newspaper. Mansfielders get the second edition, rural sections and town around Mansfield are delivered the first edition.

After the papers leave the press, they are carried along on a conveyer belt until they reach the circulation dept. There the first edition is counted into bundles, wrapped with wire, and from there the conveyer belt carries them to a waiting truck outside, from which they are delivered to the rural sections and towns around Mansfield. When the second edition arrives at the circulation dept., it goes through the same procedure and a truck takes the papers to the paper boys' houses and from there they are

delivered to the Mansfielders homes.

Another interesting room we saw, was there the type is set. This is called the composing room. Type is set on a machine called a linotype. The pieces of lead used in the linotype machine to make letters are melted down over hot fires after they have been used.

Upstairs is the news room where reporters and writers do their work. Beside this room is the library where they keep all the old newspapers. In this room is a filing cabinet where there are pictures that have been taken of each page of each newspaper that was printed in the past. They also have a set of encyclopedias in the library.

In another room are the ticket tape and tele-type machines. News from outside Mansfield comes in on these.

We also saw the dark room where the pictures are developed. There are five editors, twelve reporters, and six or seven hundred paper boys.

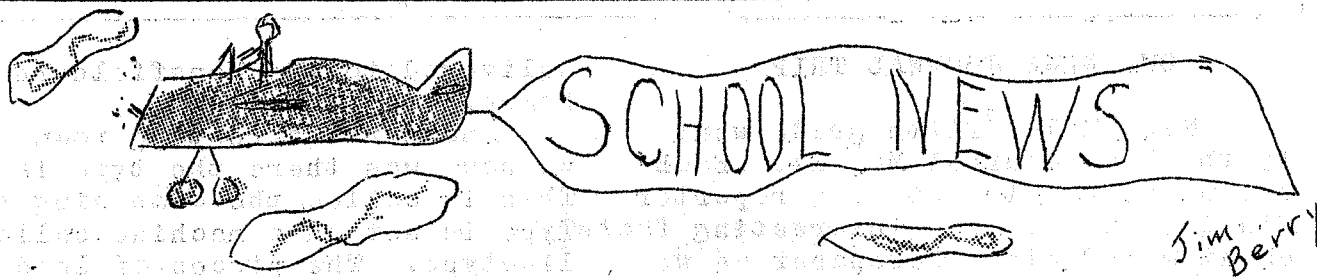
Mr. Collier, who works at the News Journal guided us through the building and answered our questions.

I learned some interesting facts about the News Journal on our trip there, and I hope you have learned something from my story, too.

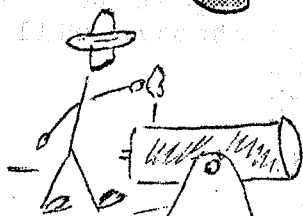
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TEACHERS VACATIONS

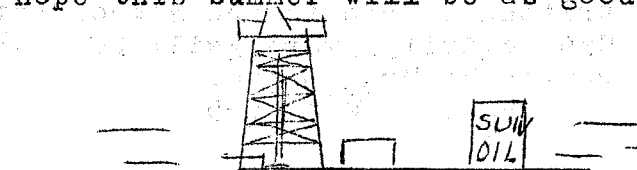
MY SUMMER PLANS

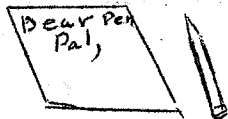

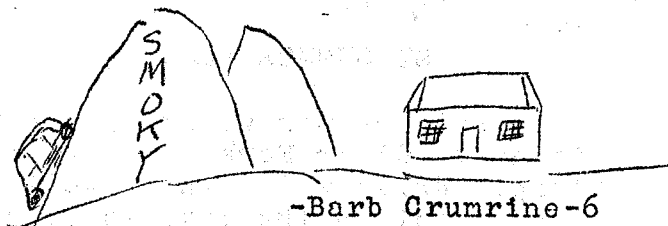

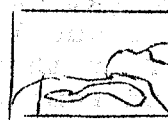

ECLIPSES

There are some parts of the world, in the far north and south which are not reached by the sun's rays for days at a time. If, in our part of the world, the sun is hidden from us on a bright day, we know that we are witnessing an eclipse.

An eclipse occurs when a dark heavenly body comes between a luminous one and the eye, or when one body moves into the shadow cast by another.

When the moon comes between the sun and the earth, so that we are in the moon's shadow, we call it eclipses of the sun. If the moon in eclipse, it means that the sun, placing the moon in our shadow.

Eclipses may be total or partial, depending on how the eclipsing body comes between the other two. Astronomers often travel thousands of miles to observe a total eclipse of the sun because they can study the sun's outermost atmosphere, or corona which is invisible at other times.

PETER ILYITCH TSCHAIKOWSKY

Peter was a Russian composer, born April 28th, 1840. He was one of seven children in the Tschaikowsky family. The home, in which he was born, was in Votkinsk, Russia. He started his work, as a composer, in 1866.

One of his best friends was N.F. Von Meck, who helped him in serious matters and loaned him a great deal of money. Peter visited America in 1890.

The music in which he wrote was not jazz. It is called classical music. It's music such as ballets, violin and piano music. One ballet, "Nutcracker Suite," was used for the "Dance of the Hours," in "Fantasia." Some of his works included, "The Overture, 1812," "Overture based on the Danish Hymn,"

The ballet "Sleeping Beauty," the ballet "Swan Lake," and he wrote music for Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, and the Tempest and Hamlet.

In 1893, he had a sudden stroke, due to an unsuccessful marriage which put him in bed for a long while. A few months later he died.

The music he wrote was very good. I have records of some of the music that he wrote. If you want a record of music, he wrote, you can buy them at Big Bear.
