



MR. HAMILTON'S SIXTH GRADE (CONT'D.) INTERESTING THINGS IN NATURE. THE VENUS FLYTRAP

Venus Flytrap is a strange neat-eating plant. It captures insects while its spikes close around its struggling victim. The jaws catch the insect then it devours it.

This plant is only found in North and South Carolina. It lives in acid soil on sandy bogs and low

pinelands.

It has small white flowers on a leaf. less sten about four to twelve inches tall. The leaves form a reddish color to attract insects. Once the insect lands the plant begins to devour it. After eight to fourteen days, the undigested pcrtions are dropped to the ground.

Then it starts over and waits for its next victin. The plant usually doesn't catch hore than three insects in a lifetime. Maureen Vollmer - 6

Monkey is a common name for many mammals of the order Primates (any member of the most highly developed order of animals.) Monkeys

include only the group with long tails and short narrow faces. This leaves out apes. Apos are larger than monkeys and have rather short tails or no tails. But some monkeys, including baboons, also have no tails.

The apes include gorillas, chimpanzoes, orangutans, and gibbons.

The name monkey comes from an Italian word meaning "Old Woman". It refeers to the monkeys face, which looks like that of a wrinkled old woman.

MISS SMITH'S FIFTH GRADE

PLANTS

Our classroom has been doing many science experiments. We do then as units. Now our unit is on plants. We are going to do an experiment on an onion and a white potato. The naterials we need are a white potato, onion, plastic sandwich bags and a knife. We have to cut the potato in three or four pieces. Then we place each piece in a sandwich bag. After that we add water to a depth of one centimeter.

Now the onion. We trim away any plant growing above and below the onion. Then we put the onion in a sandwich bag. Then we add one centimeter and check it daily for several days to see what happens.

We did these experiments before we left for Easter vacation. Here are the materials. plastic sandwich bags, paper towels, radish seeds, corn seeds, or bean seeds, a microscope, stapler, and scissors.

We had to cut the paper towel so that it could be put into a sandwich bag. Then we placed either four radish seeds or four bean seeds. Then we put the four seeds on the paper towel and stapled the paper towel to the bag.

After we got back from vacation, we saw a lot of roots. Then we planted them each in small pots. A lot of them died after a few days, but the ones that are still living are growing bigger and bigger.
