Raylene Sewell said she isn't going with anybody. Verona Mason wanted to go with Donnic or Ronnie Eatmon. Bye, bye. See you there!

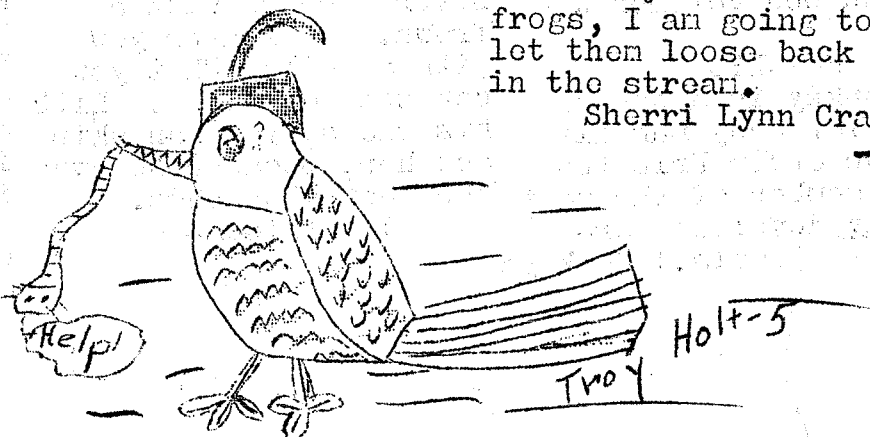

IN NATURE.

THE VENUS FLYTRAP

Venus Flytrap is a strange meat-eating plant. It captures insects while its spikes close around its struggling victim. The jaws catch the insect then it devours it.

This plant is only found in North and South Carolina. It lives in acid soil on sandy bogs and low pinelands.

It has small white flowers on a leafless stem about four to twelve inches tall. The leaves form a reddish color to attract insects. Once the insect lands the plant begins to devour it. After eight to fourteen days, the undigested portions are dropped to the ground.

Then it starts over and waits for its next victim. The plant usually doesn't catch more than three insects in a lifetime.

MISS SMITH'S FIFTH GRADE

PLANTS

Our classroom has been doing many science experiments. We do them as units. Now our unit is on plants. We are going to do an experiment on an onion and a white potato. The materials we need are a white potato, onion, plastic sandwich bags and a knife. We have to cut the potato in three or four pieces. Then we place each piece in a sandwich bag. After that we add water to a depth of one centimeter.

Now the onion. We trim away any plant growing above and below the onion. Then we put the onion in a sandwich bag. Then we add one centimeter and check it daily for several days to see what happens.

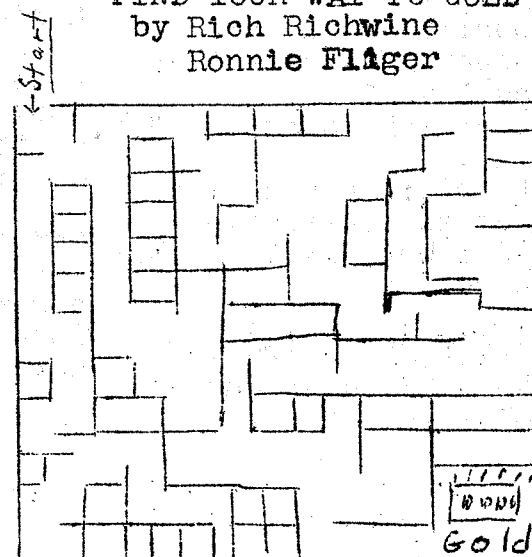
