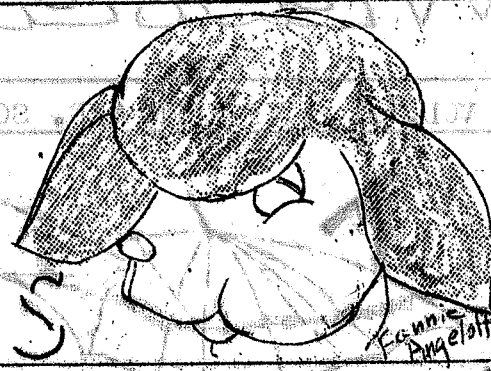
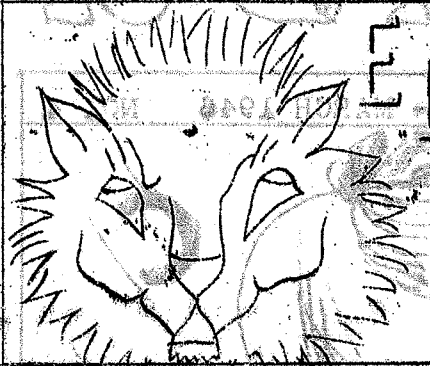

"But I can't find my way," wailed a sorry-looking little bear cub.

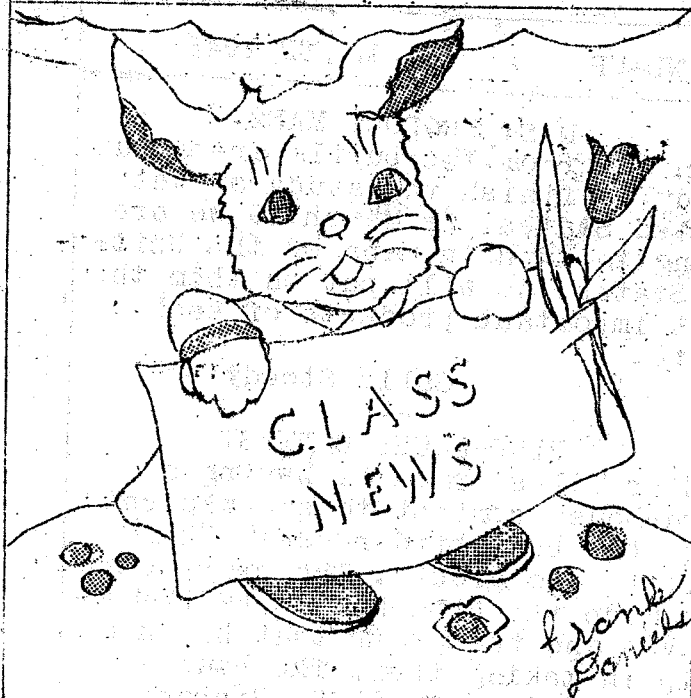
"We'll show you the way," they said.
