

Andrew Jackson was born in 1767 at Meckenburg County, N. Carolina, He joined the Army at the age os 13 years, and remained until the war was ower.

In 1784 he began the study of law and in 1788 was appointed solicitor for the Western district of N. Carolina, now the state of Tennesee.

Jackson was elected President of the United States by the Democrat party, 1828 and was reelected by a still laarger majority in i832.

Jackson died in 1845. elected to the American Hall of Fame in 1910. His tirthday was on March 15, 1952.

STEAMBOATS

The term steamboat is used for steamdriven vessels which sail on rivers, and also for the smaller ones on lakes or in the coastal waters of the sea. The Steamship is used for large vessels such as those sailing on the open sea. John Fitch built the first workable steamboat in 1787. The financially successful steamboat was Robert Fultons "Clearmont". In 1807, it steamed the 150 miles up the Hudson River from New York City to Albany in 32 hours. Before the vast development of the railroad systems of the United States, the steamboat was important in carrying passengers on the great rivers. On the Great Lakes steamboats and steamships are used to carry most of the nations iron, ore and wheat. as well as coal, limestone, and other porducts.
