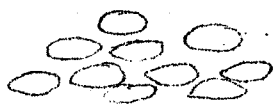
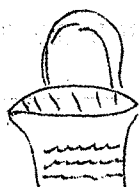

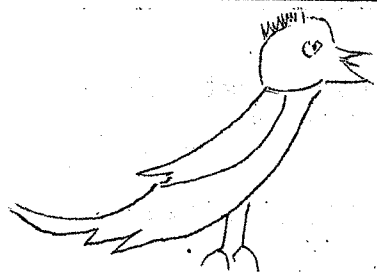

The school pictures were excellent this year. Over 90% of the students had all of their pictures. Only four students out of 366 children did not have pictures because they did not turn out well or the child had moved.

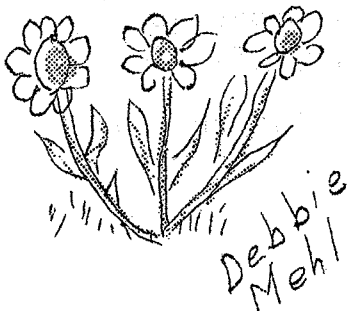
There were twenty-seven retakes. Twenty-three were new students or were absent at the time the pictures were taken. The retakes should be back soon.

1875 the first telephone was made.

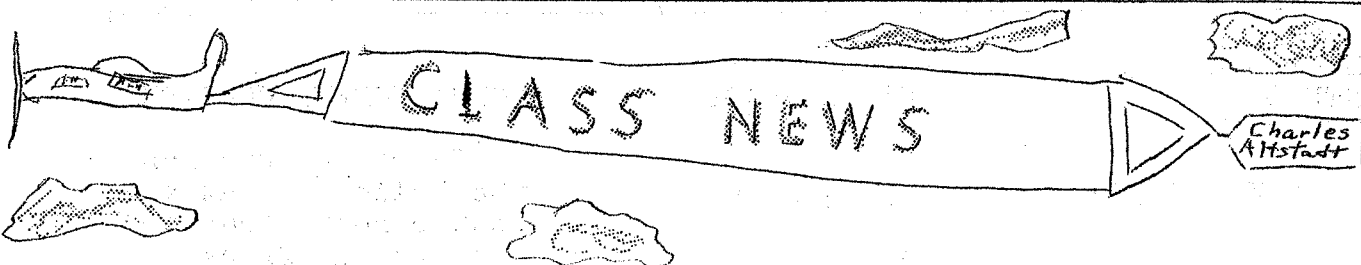

## THE CALENDAR TODAY

Most people in the Western World use the Gregorian calendar, worked out in the 1580's by Pope Gregory XIII. It has twelve months, eleven of them with 30 or 31 days. The other month, February, normally has 28 days. Every fourth year, it has 29 days. But even this calendar is not quite exact enough. In century years that cannot be divided by 400, such as 1700, 1800, and 1900, the extra day must be dropped. The year 1600 was a leap year; 2000 will be one.

Our calendar is supposed to be based on the year Jesus Christ was born. All dates listed before that year are listed as B. C. or Before Christ. Dates after that year are listed as A. D. or Anno Domini, meaning in the year of Our Lord. Non-Christians often write B. C. E. for before Christian's era, and C. E. for Christian's era.
