She likes this school a lot.

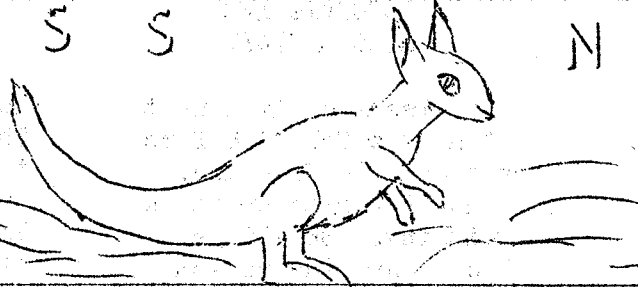

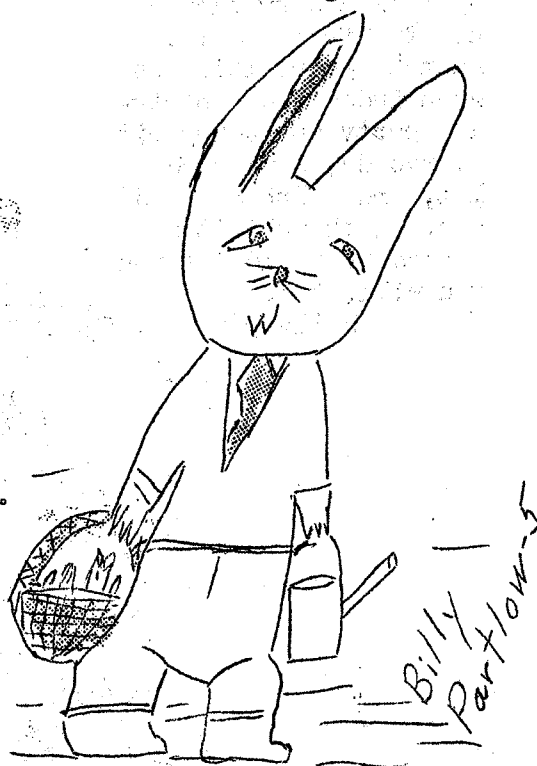

THE BLIZZARD of 1978

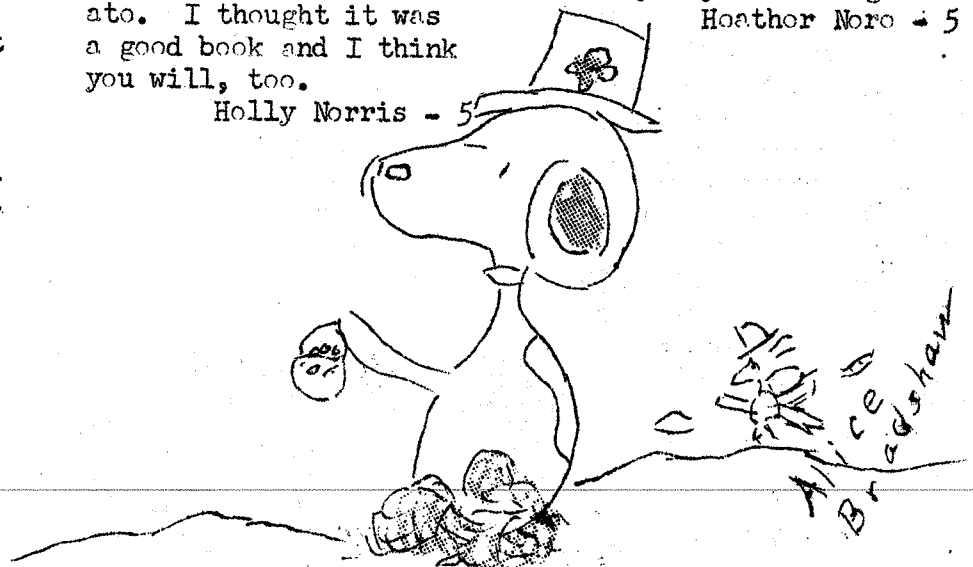

We have a tray with bones and we try to arrange them in order.

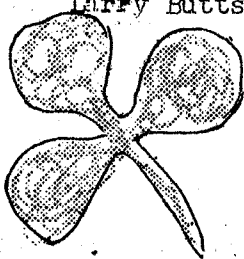
There were skeloton bones of cats, rabbits and a mink.
