

Decoration Day is a day of dignified addresses, exercises, parades and military salutes, as well as the strewing of flowers and planting of shrubs.

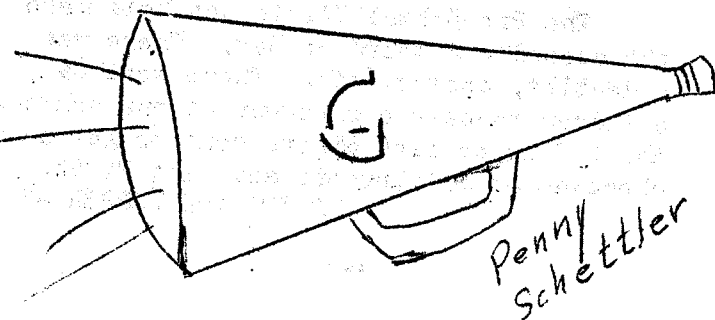

MY SCHOOL IN VIENNA

I want to tell you about my school in Vienna, Austria. The school was five stories high and had thirty-three rooms. We had a gym too. We also had a wood-working shop.

We went to school from eight to one o'clock, but we had to go to school on Saturday too. If the children came before 8 o'clock, they had to clean up the room.

When the teacher or principal came into the room, the pupils all stood up and remained standing until they were told to sit. When the pupils met a teacher or the principal in the hall or on the street, the boys bowed from the waist and the girls curtsied. Boys and girls were not in the same room, even in the lower grades.

The teachers did not have as much work to do as they do here, because the pupils helped each other. Each class was divided into groups of six. Each group chose a group leader who was usually the best student and well behaved. The group leader helped the others with their work or assigned some other member to help the one who needed it. The six pupils sat together around a table.

In each class there were also two class leaders. Each Saturday the group leaders reported to the class leaders and the class leaders reported to the teacher. The group leaders reported on neatness of work, home work, cooperation and attendance. The group having the best record was given a special reward.

Once a week, the class leaders of the whole school were called together. They formed a school council headed by three boys chosen from the group. They talked over things that needed improving and decided what could be done about them.

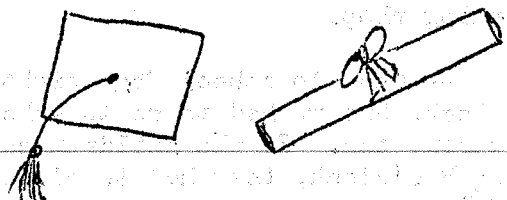

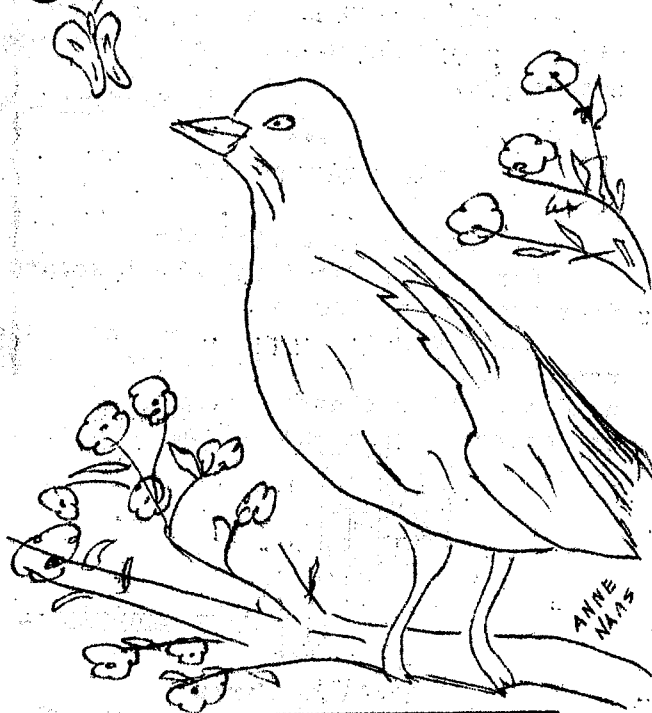

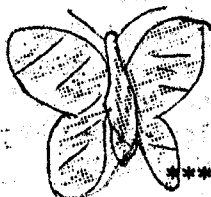
A New Girl

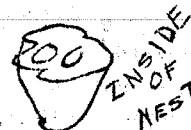
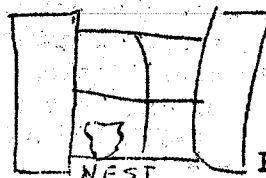
A Blue Jay

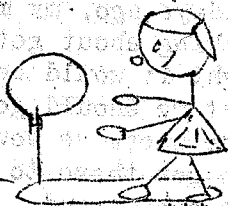
My Hamsters

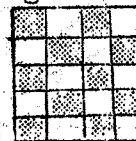

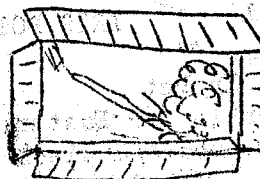
"Getaway"

as I put the can down, it went right in. There was another snake with it, but it struck at us and went in the water. Getaway struck, too, but we caught it after a little run.

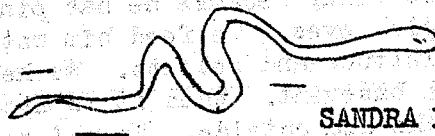
The place where we caught the snake was on land we owned six and one-tenth miles out of town.

The Snake

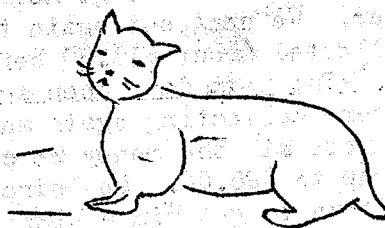

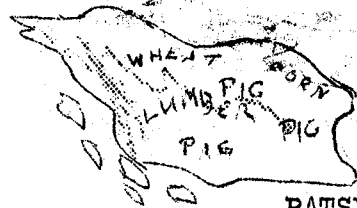

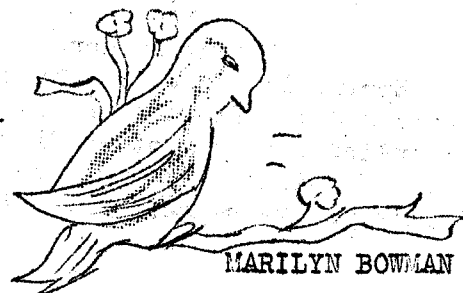
Bird Study
