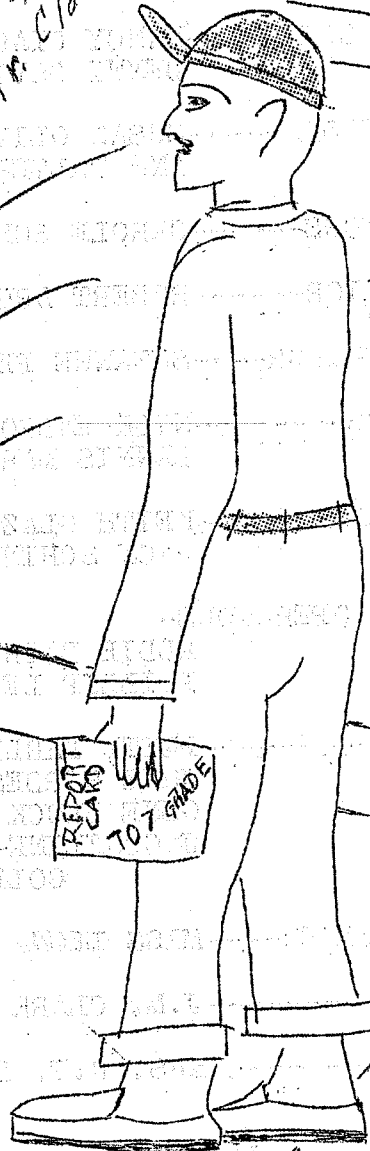

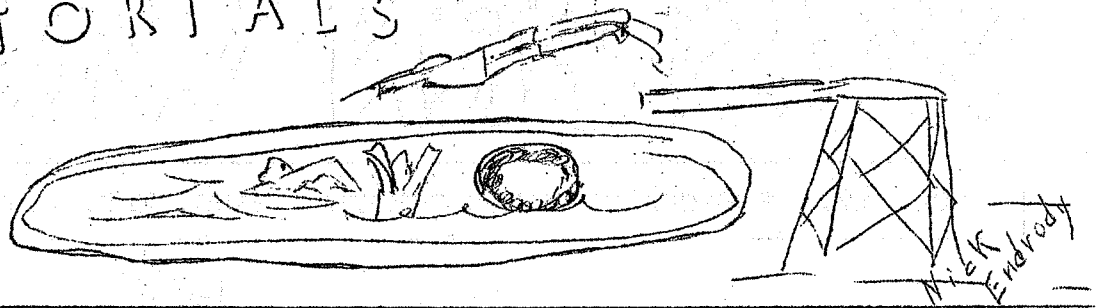

The Confederate women started this custom right after the Civil War, decorating the graves of the Confederate soldiers. The Union women then started it.

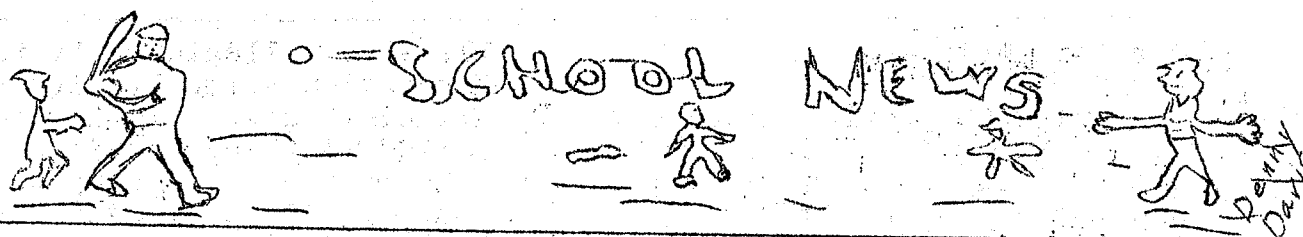
We now decorate all graves. Now the soldiers graves are marked with flags so we can tell them from regular graves.

The movie-crew will get to go also. They all have to have a note from their parents saying they can go. Mr. Clark will go up in the airplane too.

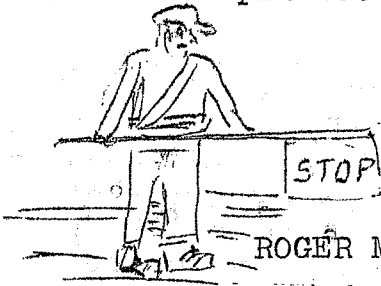

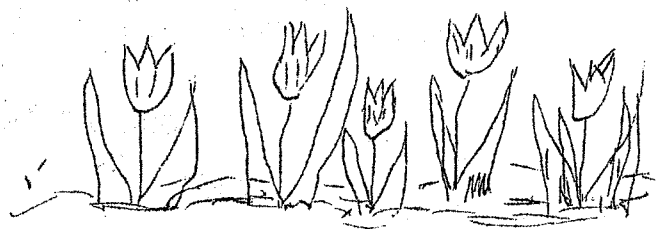

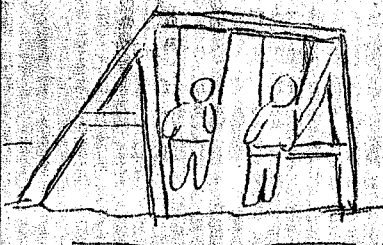
NEW SCHOOL BOUNDARIES

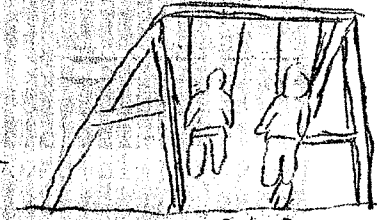

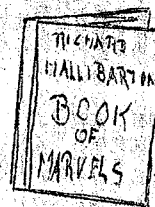
### THE BOOK OF MARVELS

This book can be bought at Ritter's Book Store and other stores. Some of the children in our room are going to buy it. We hope you will like it, too.



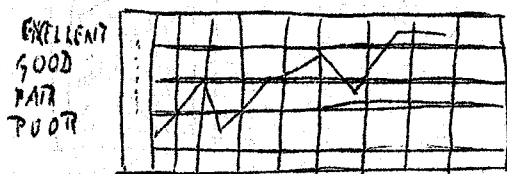

He was spreading cheer.



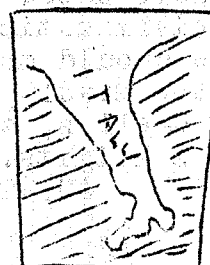

## OUR BIRD WALK

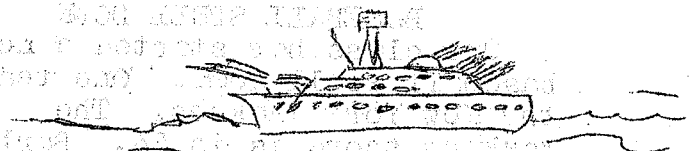
Our class goes on bird walks on some nice mornings. We list the names of the birds we see. Then when we get back to the room we count how many birds we have seen.

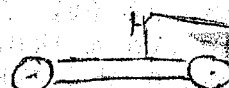

## IN THE SUMMER

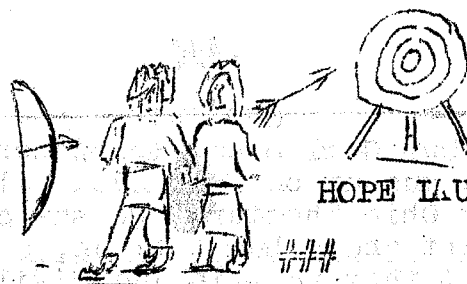
This summer my mother said she would take me to Washington, D.C. where I was born. If I go I will see the Capitol and the White House. Then I will see the hospital where I was born.

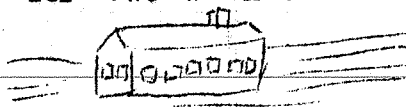

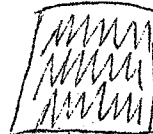
## OUR CLASS
