


The Conferderate women start this custom right after the Civil War, decorating the graves of the Confederate soldiers. The Union women then atarted it.


We now decorate all graves.

The movie-crew will get to go also. They all have to have a note from their parents saying they can go. Mr. Clark will go up in the airplane too.



Each day a person in our room reads a story about something we have studied or something that is interesting.


This book can be bought at Ritter's Book Store and other stores. Some of the children in our room are going to buy it. We hope you will like it, too.
