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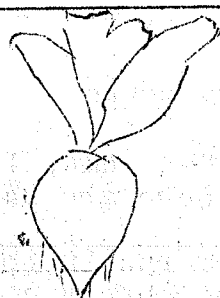
MOTHER'S DAY

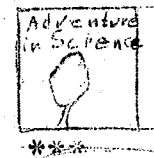
SCIENCE READERS

In my science book I am reading about many interesting things. I have read about sound, stone, stars, planets, caves, and many other interesting things.

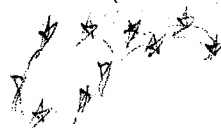

Nobody can get to the nearest star because it would take 100 or more years.

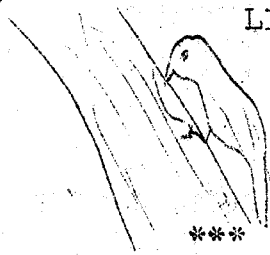

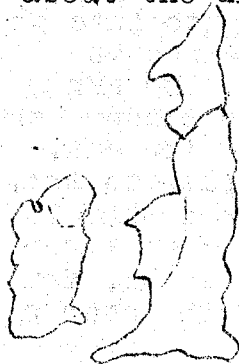

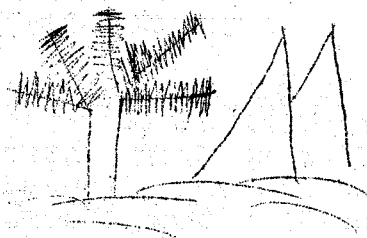
After we had our pictures taken and got them back, every one was very pleased. I think the pictures of the boys and girls in my room were very good. We all had fun exchanging with each other.

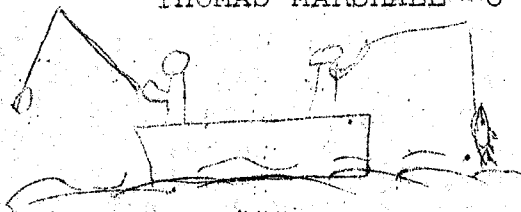

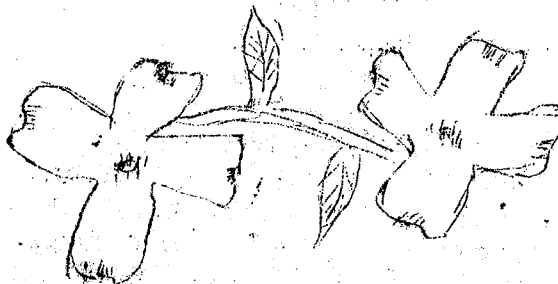
DOGWOOD PICTURES

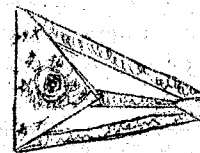

Cathy Kleinknecht won the prize for having the highest score. Her prize was two baby chicks.

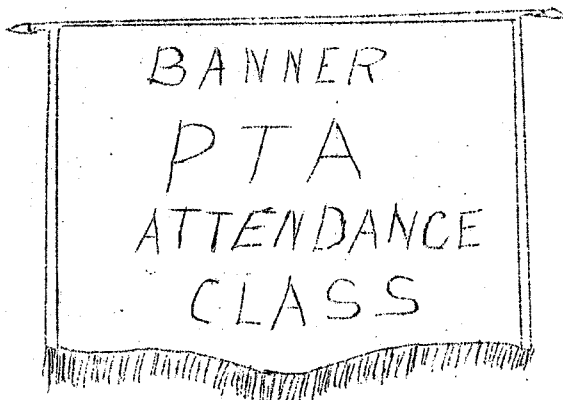

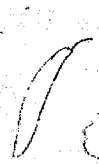
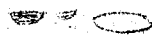
GOURDS
