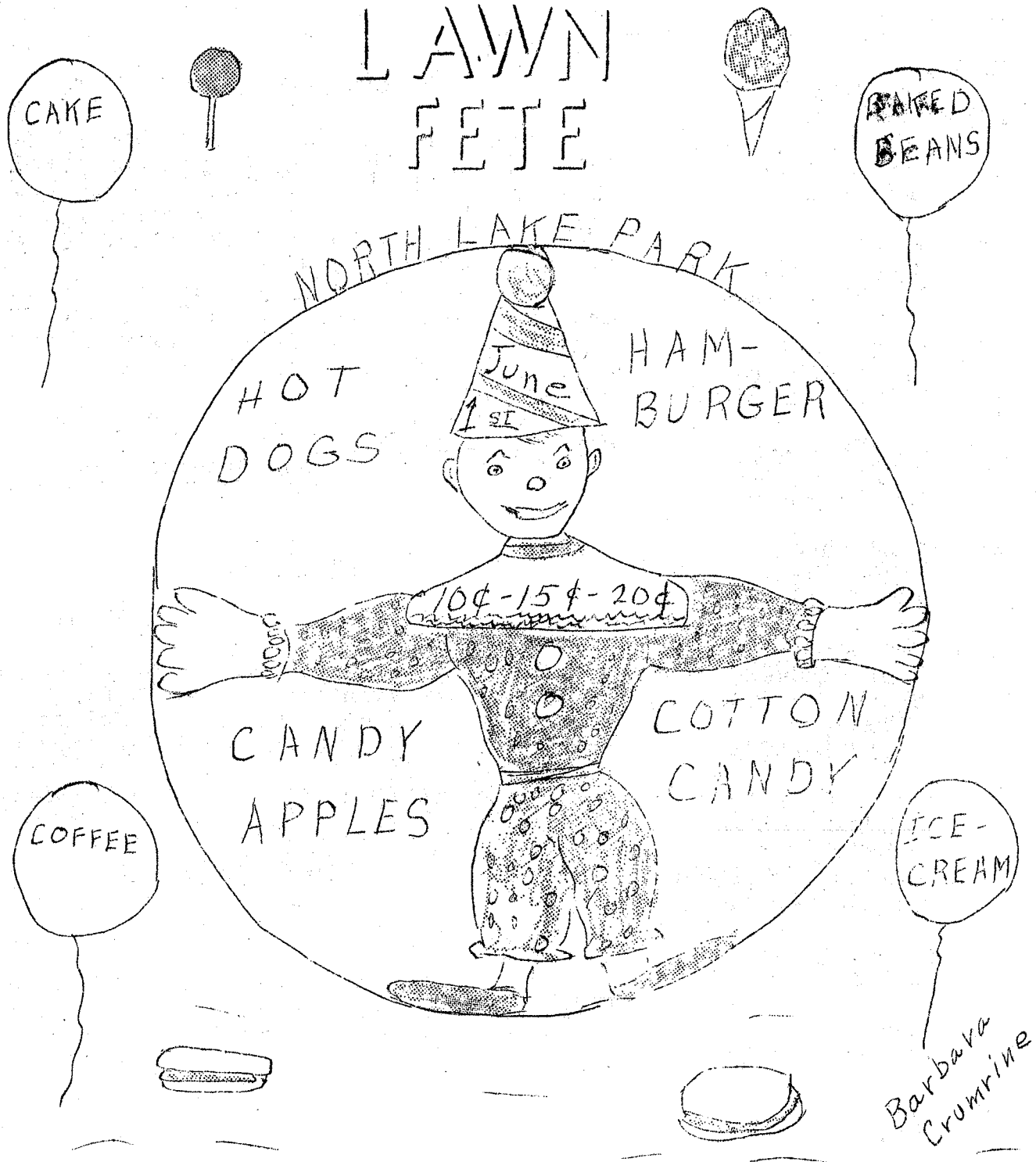
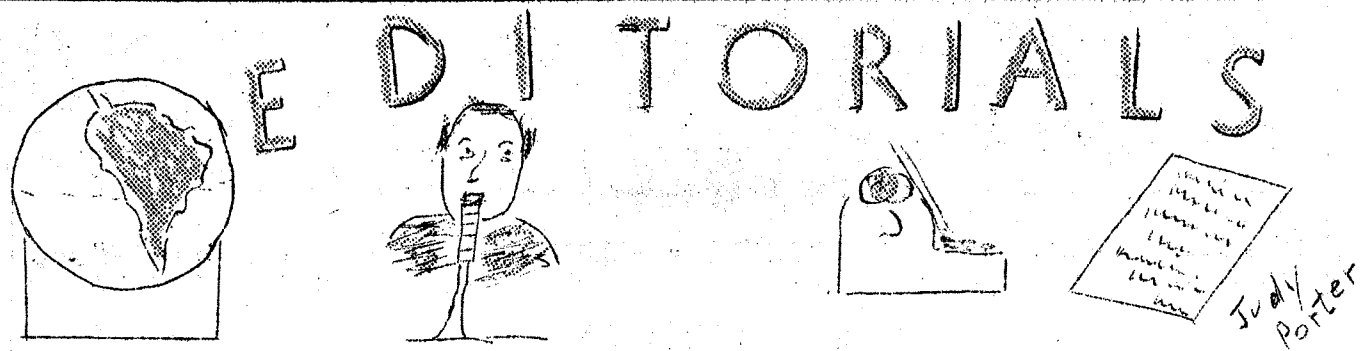

MEMORIAL OR DECORATION DAY

Memorial Day is to honor those members of America's Armed forces. Originally Memorial Day was set aside to honor the men who died in the War between the States. Its observance now includes those who died in the Spanish-American War and World Wars I and II.

Memorial Day is a legal holiday in most states of the Union. The Northern States celebrate May 30th as Memorial Day. The Southern States have their own days for honoring their soldier dead. Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi set aside April 26th as Memorial Day. North and South Carolina observe this holiday on May 10th; Louisiana and Tennessee on June 3; and Virginia on May 30.

Memorial Day originated when southern women scattered spring flowers on the graves of soldiers during the War between the States. They honored the Northern dead as well as their own dead in this way. After the war, 1868, General John A. Logan named May 30 as a special day for honoring the graves of the Union soldiers.

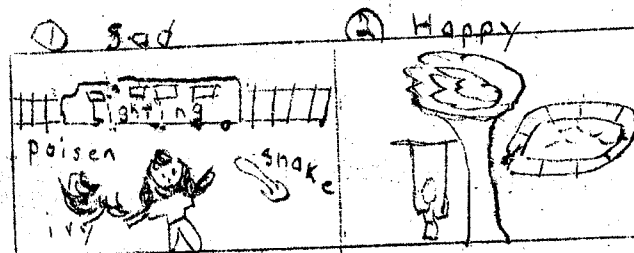

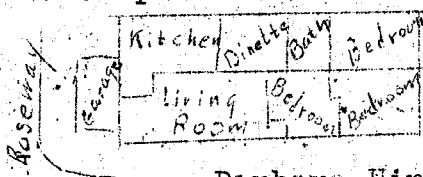
A TRIP TO YOUNGSTOWN

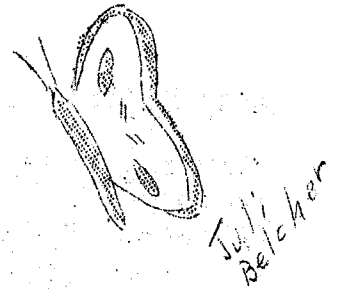
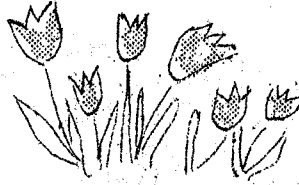
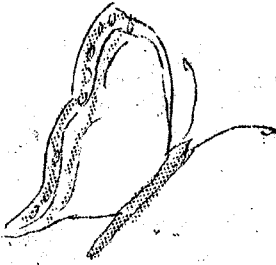

On Monday, May 14th, Sheila Jewell brought some baby tadpoles and a baby frog for our aquarium.

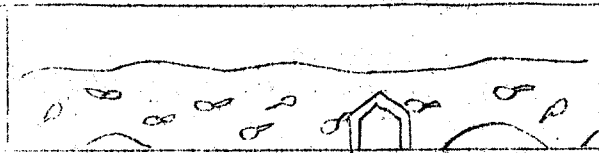
The baby tadpoles are very little black ones.

In our class we made whirl-a-ways. They are boxes with the same round ends. You roll them and they come back to you. What's the secret? Well, here it is.

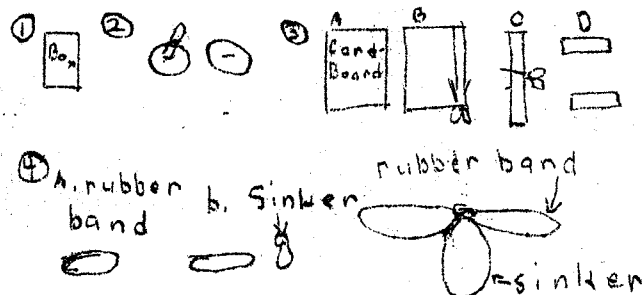
1. First you get a mothers' oats box or cornmeal box, or an ice cream pint box, or anything that has round, even, ends.

2. Then a sinker or heavy bolt, or something that is small and will fit into your box.

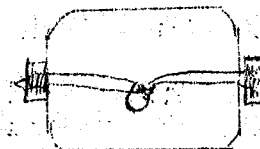
3. Get a rubber band.

The village did not have any books to teach school with, so David Zeisberger wrote a speller. He sent it to Philadelphia to have copies made of it. The village had eighteen laws. Some were:

1. We will know no other God but the one only true God, who made us, and came into this world to save us, to Him we will pray.
2. We will rest from work on the Lord's Day, and attend public services.
3. We will honor father and mother and when they grow old and needy we will do for them what we can.
4. No person shall get leave to dwell with us until our teachers have given their consent and the helpers have examined him.
5. We will have nothing to do with thieves, murderers, or drunkards.

6. We will not take part in dances, sacrifices, festivals, or games.

7. We will use no witchcraft when hunting.

8. We will not tell lies.

9. We will help our teachers when they need us.

10. We will not be idle nor scold nor beat each other.

Schoenbrunn Village was built over in 1927. Now it is a lovely state park. The cemetery is called God's Acre.

When we were cleaning the place up I was still fishing and I finally caught the fish. It was a Big Mouth bass. We took it home and will eat it tonight.

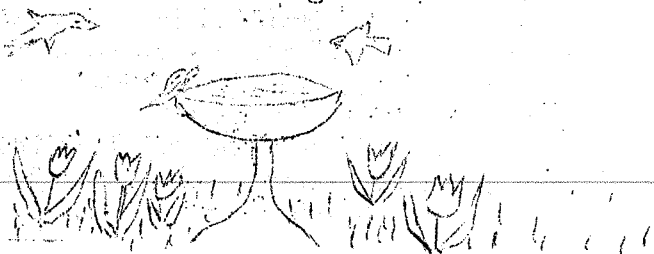

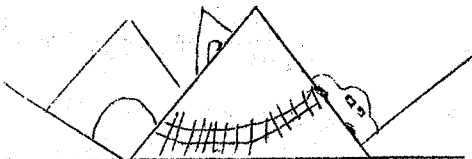


We have a miracle bowl in our room. It is full of flower seeds.

Already sweet peas and morning glories are coming up. The morning glories are climbing up the string on the blind. We have had one purple morning glory.

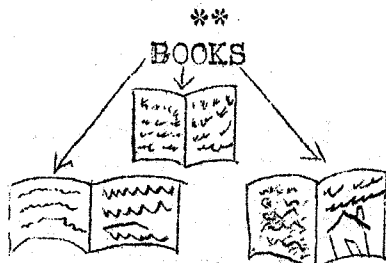
