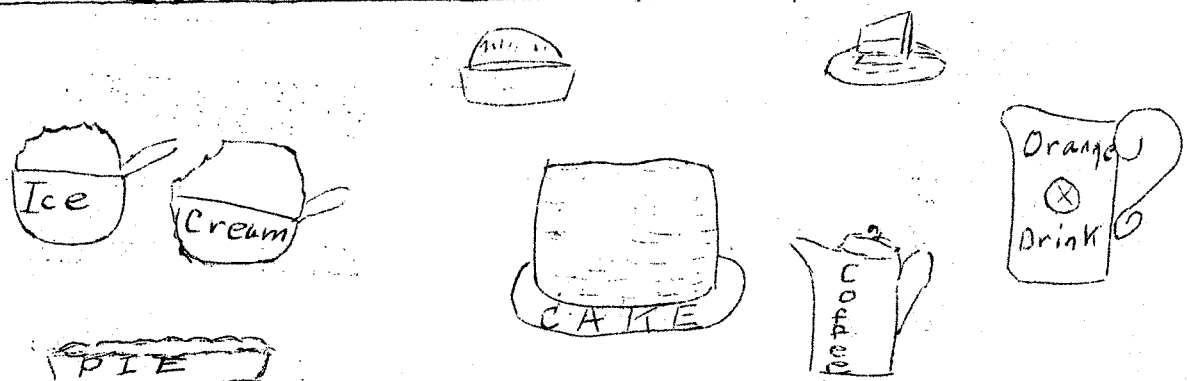
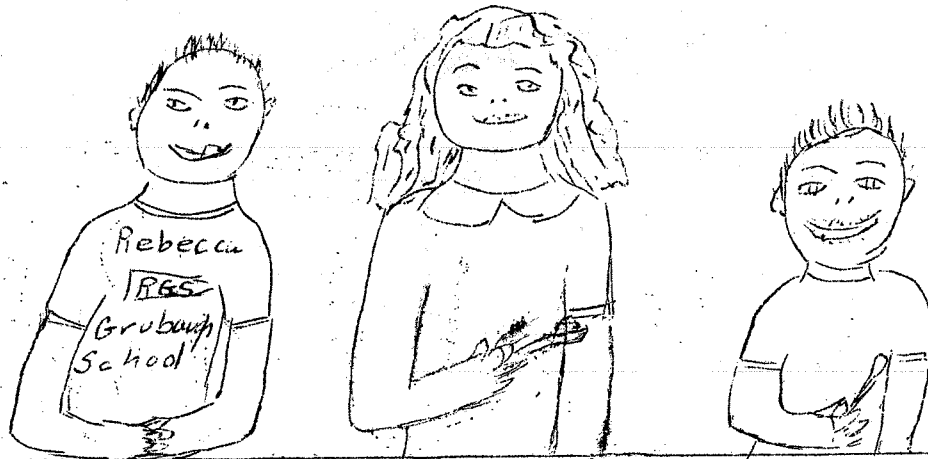

Here are some of the things we can do: After everyone leaves and we are done working we can get seconds if we wish. On Friday we get ice cream if we wish.

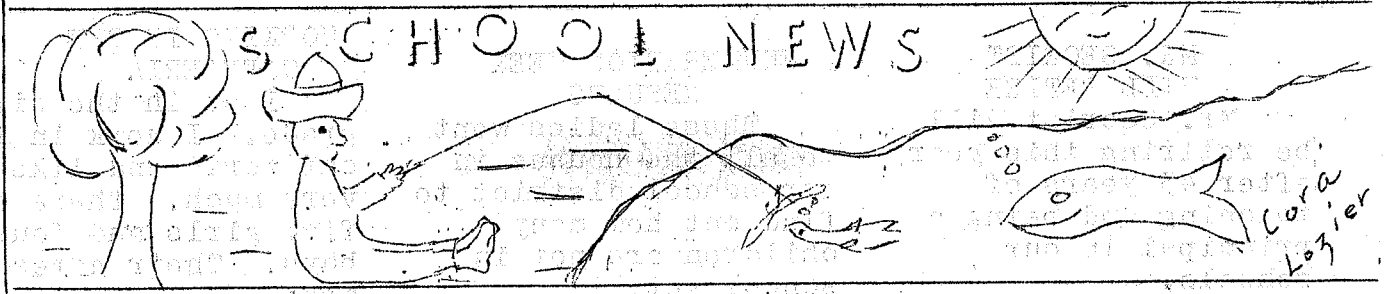
I enjoyed working and I know the rest of the workers enjoyed it also. I know and hope next year many fifth graders will want to work in the cafeteria.

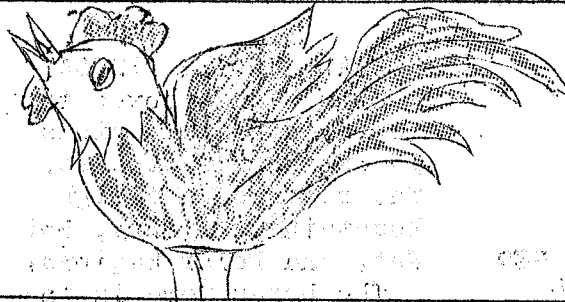

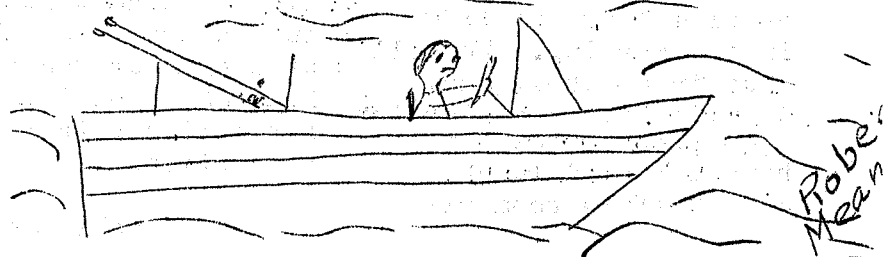

HOW TO MAKE AN
ELECTROMAGNET

First take an iron nail about four inches long and wrap about twenty turns of insulated wire around it. Leave about a foot of wire to both ends. Connect the two wires to a dry cell. Now see how many paper clips you can pick up. Now wind forty turns of insulated wire around the nail. Now connect the wires to the battery and see how many paper clips you can pick up.
