

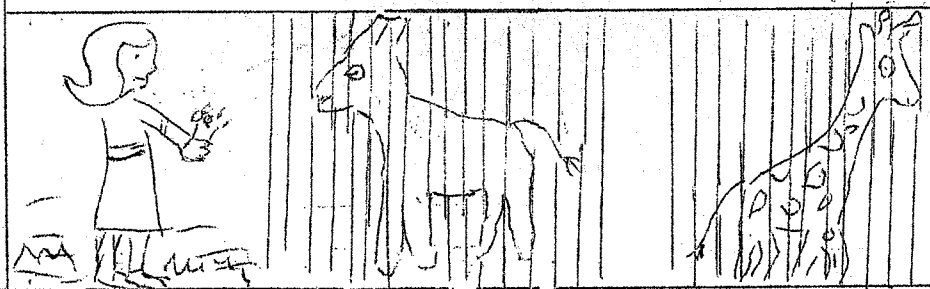

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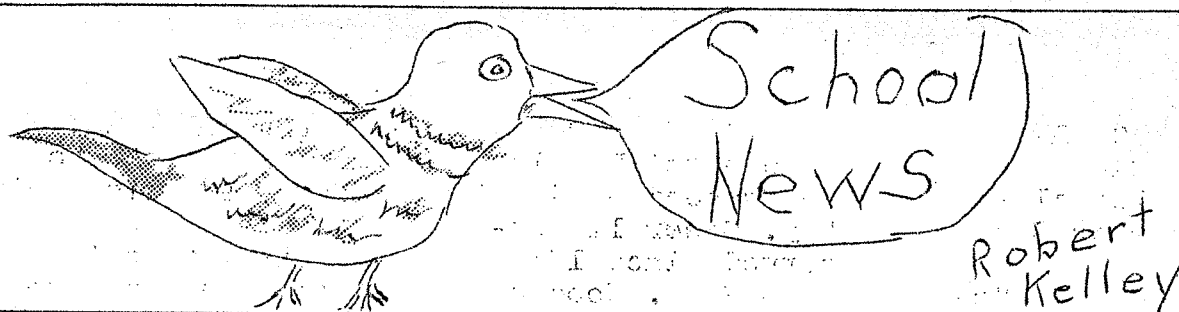

Mothers' Day is also celebrated in many foreign countries. A white carnation may be worn for a mother who has died, and a red carnation for a mother who is living.
