



In 1868 Gen. John A. Logan, Commander and Chief of the Grant Army of the Republic, named May 30th. May had been chosen because that was the date of discharge of the last Union volunteers. Southern States observe Confederate Mcmorial Day on April 26, May 10, or June 3. Nancy Thorpe-6

MOTHERS' DAY Mothers' Day is the second Sunday in May. Generally observed since 1914, when Pres. Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation to celebrate it and ordered the United States flag displayed on all public buildings.

The first observance was in 1907, when Anna M. Jarvis of Philadelphia suggested that a special service for mothers be in a Philadelphia church. The next year other churches held similar services.

Mothers' Day is also celebrated in many foreign countries. A white carnation may be worn for a mother who has died, and a red carnation for a mother who is living. Sally Clifford-6
