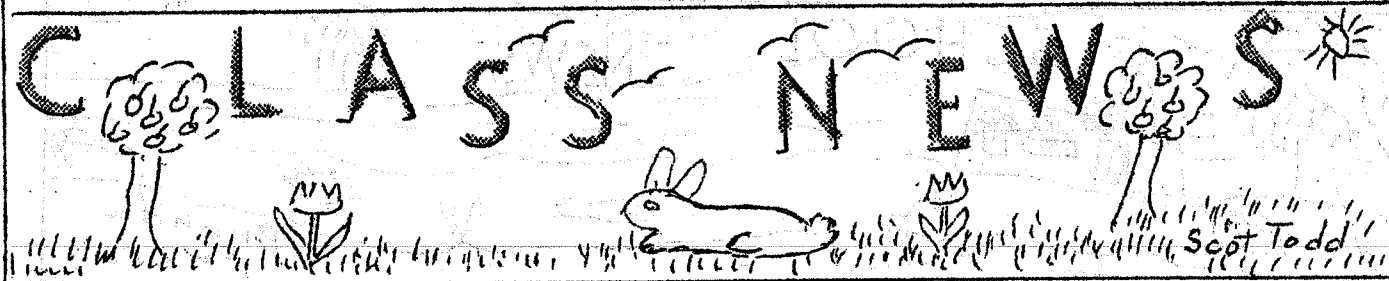
I am going to try out. If I make it I want to do pole vaulting or high jumping.

2 cups table salt

2/3 cup water

1 cup cornstarch

1/2 cup cold water

Mix salt and 2/3

cup water in saucepan; stir until mixture is well heated, three to four minutes. Remove from heat; add cornstarch mixed with cold water. Stir quickly. Mixture should have consistency of thick, stiff dough. If it does not thicken, place over low heat; stir about one minute until it forms a pliable mass. Add food color if desired.
