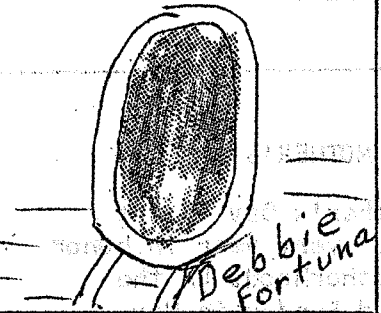
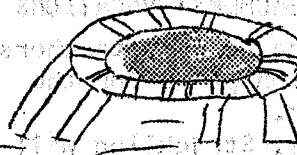
## THANK YOU - MOTHERS

## WONDER CHOCOLATE PUDDING

- |                         |  |
|-------------------------|--|
| 1 cup sifted flour      | 1 square chocolate (melted)            |
| $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt |  |
| $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar | $\frac{3}{4}$ cup chopped nuts         |
| 2 tsp. baking powder    | $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar                |
| $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk  | $\frac{1}{2}$ cup brown sugar (packed) |
| 1 tsp. vanilla          | 1 tbsp. cocoa                          |
| 2 tbsp. melted butter   | 1 cup boiling water                    |

Mix the salt,  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup of sugar and baking powder. Add vanilla, melted butter and chocolate to the milk. Add to dry ingredients, mixing thoroughly. Add chopped nuts. Spread in a greased 8 inch square pan. Blend the sugars and cocoa and sprinkle over the top of the batter. Pour the boiling water over all and bake in a 350 degree oven for about 40 minutes or until done. Serve warm or cold with cream or slightly sweetened whipped cream. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

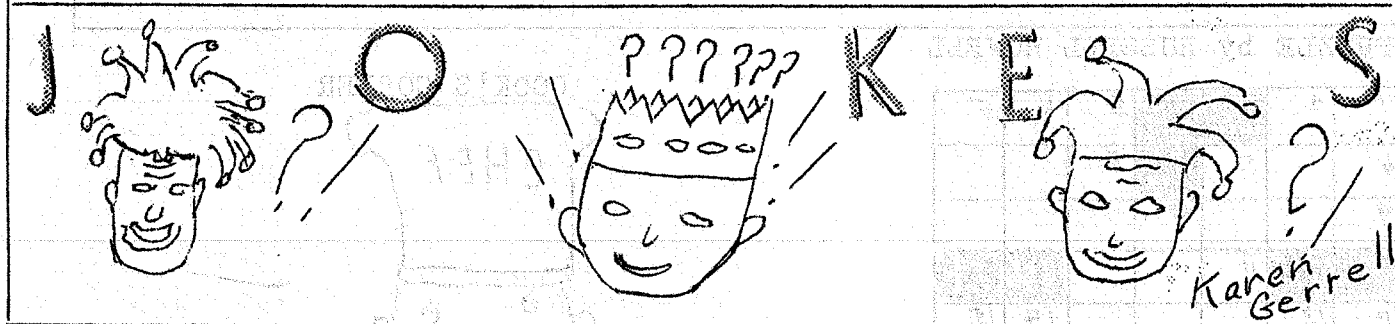
