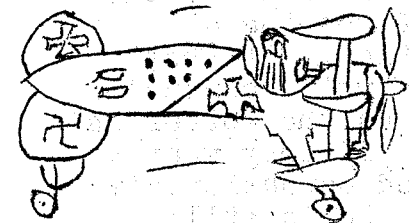
MR. HARING'S FIFTH GRADE

The Red Baron shot down 80 planes before he was killed. The "Baron" shot down 3 out of 5 enemy planes. One of the two enemy planes that survived hit the tail of the aces plane. The Baron didn't make it back to the base. He crashed and was killed.

GENERAL JOHN J. PERSHING
(1860-1940) WORLD WAR I

Pershing's greatest work as commander of the A.E.F. was to preserve the unity of the American Army in combat. The allied generals wanted to use the fresh American troops to fill the ranks of their battered armies, but Pershing insisted that the American Army should fight independently. He believed that the knowledge of a large, fresh American Army had been trained for fast, driving warfare, which Pershing believed was needed to win. He opposed the slow trench warfare of the allied armies. Other American general sided with the allied general, but Pershing held out. In the end, his theories proved to be correct.

Later Career

Pershing served as chief of staff of the U. S. Army from 1921 to 1924, and then retired. His memoirs, "My Experiences in the World War" won the 1932 Pulitzer prize for history. Pershing took no active part in World War II, but American military leaders frequently consulted him. He was buried in Arlington National Cemetery.

making note pads for the hospital. You make a design on the front of the cut cardboard. Then put paper in it the same size. The patients in the hospital use them for note pads.

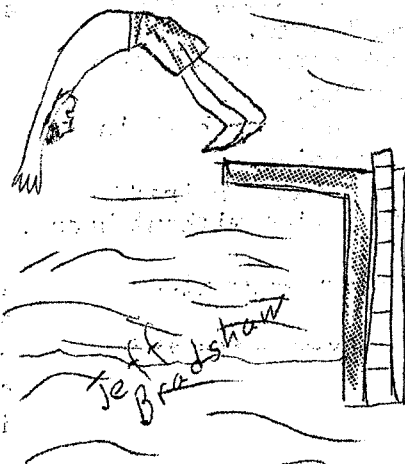

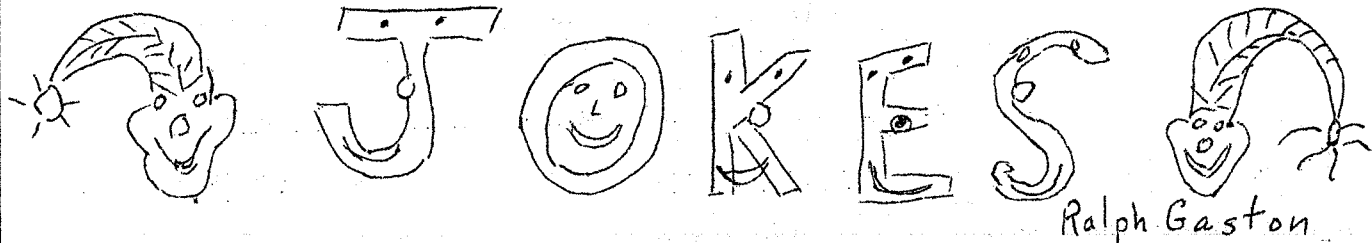


MELLOW SQUARES

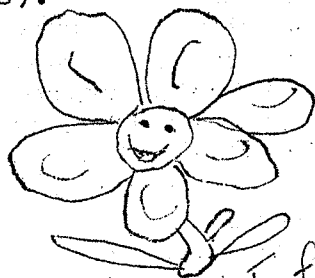

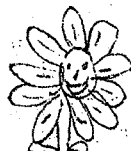
