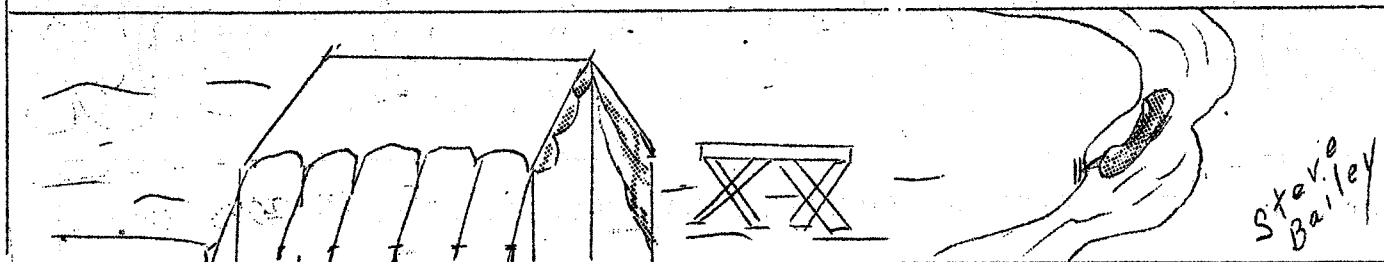

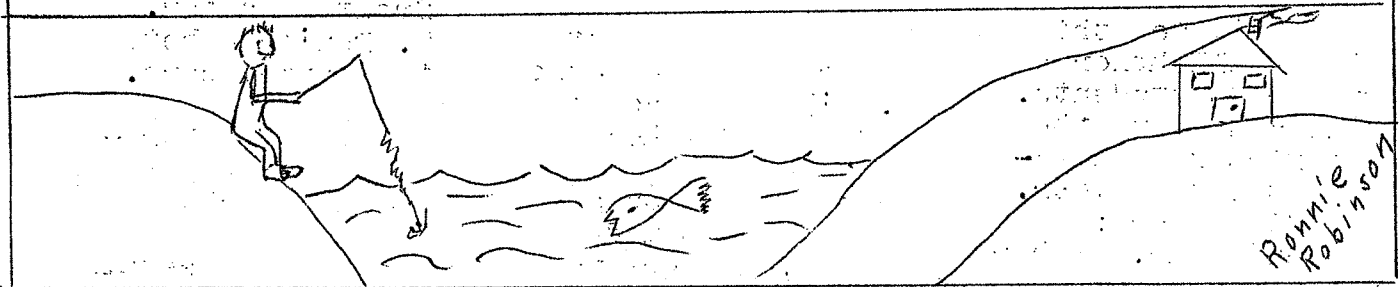

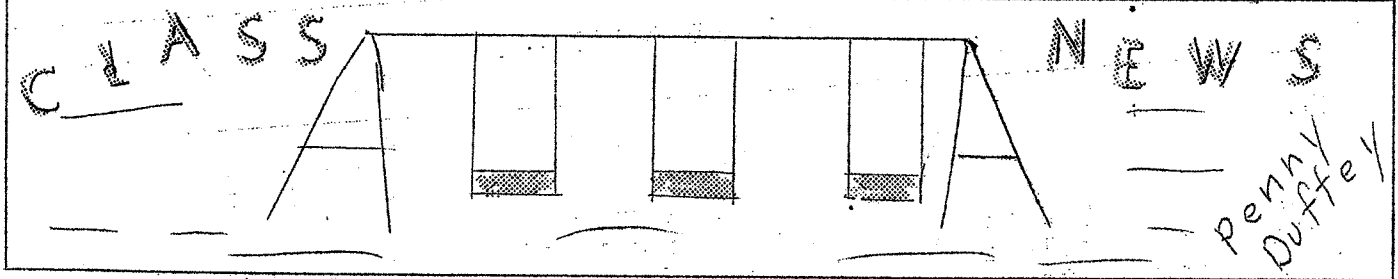

It got lost and ran in the street. A truck came and ran over it and killed the dog.

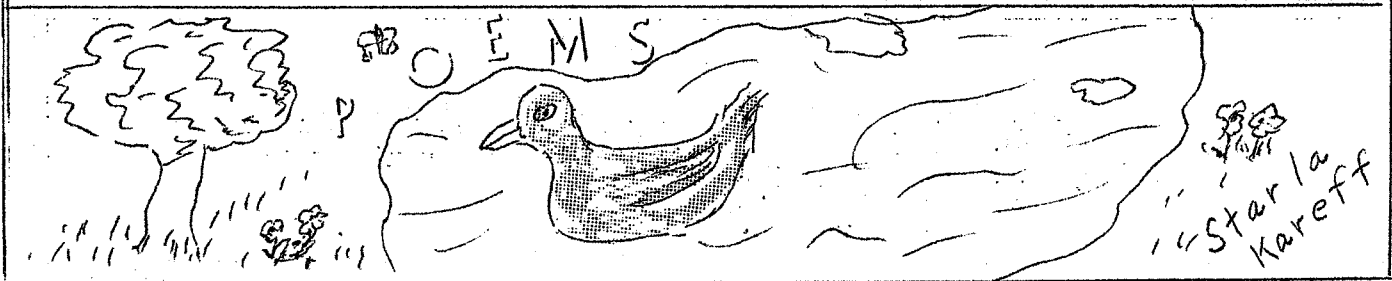
