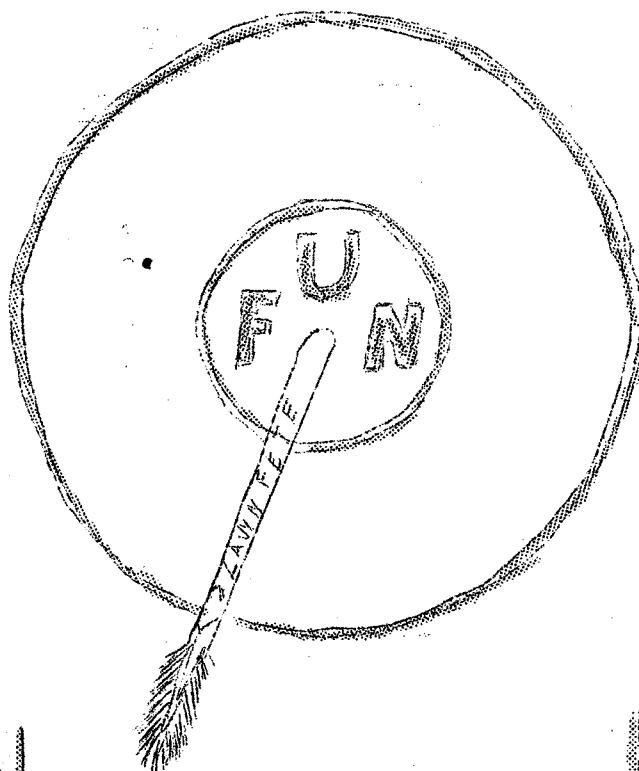

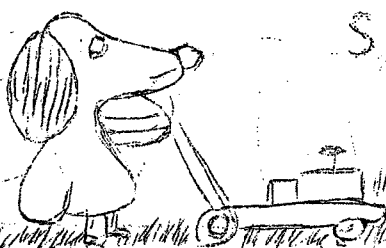

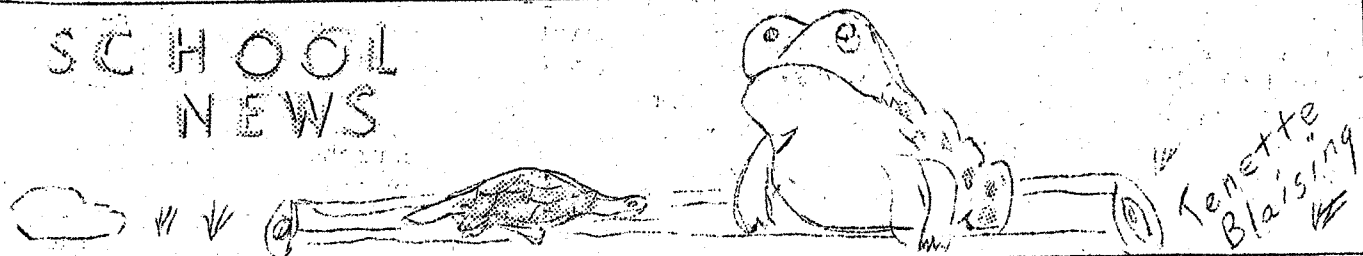

TINY

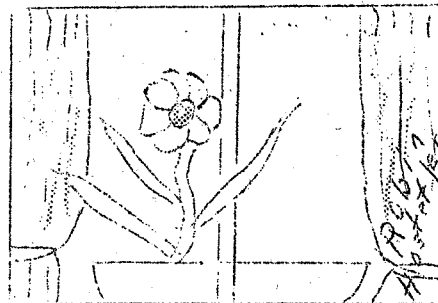

LASER BEAMS

The laser is a new kind of light. The device that makes a kind of light is called a laser.

The sources of a light are made up of different kinds of frequencies. Waves of a laser light go in the same direction. The beam is instantly bright and lasts only a fraction of a millionth of a second. The flash of the laser light though hot, lasts so short a time that it does not burn the tissues surrounding the retina. A laser beam aimed at the moon, 238,836 miles away, would cover an area only a mile in diameter. Did you know a laser beam could boil a pot of coffee a thousand miles away. The laser beam was invented in 1958 by Professor Charles Townes of Columbia University and Dr. Arthur Schawlow of the Bell Telephone Laboratories.

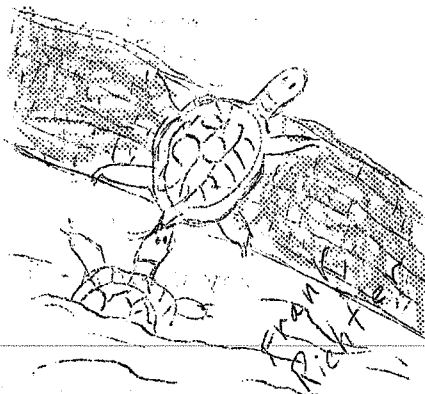
People have made many changes in this part of the Northeast since the days Indians lived there.

Mix until crumbly.

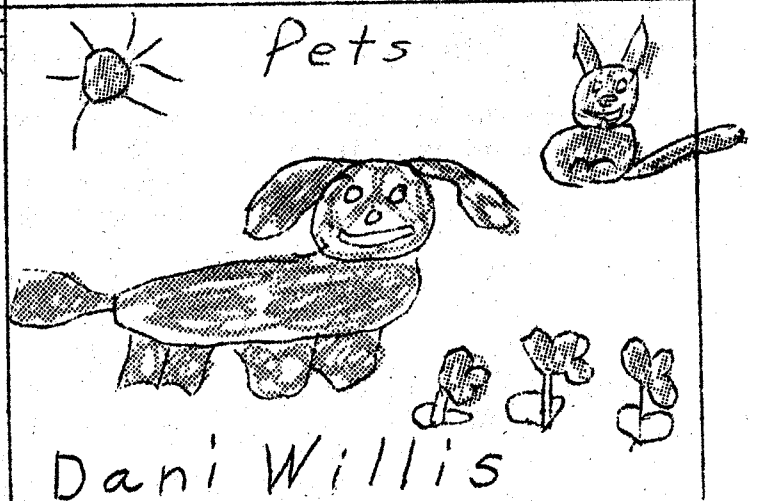
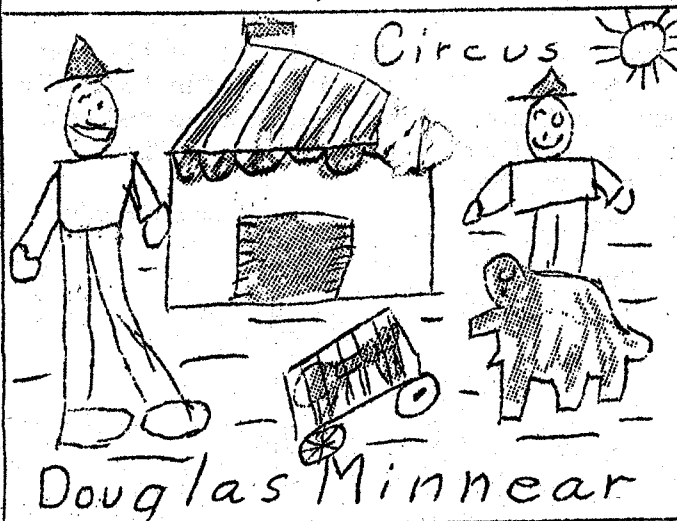
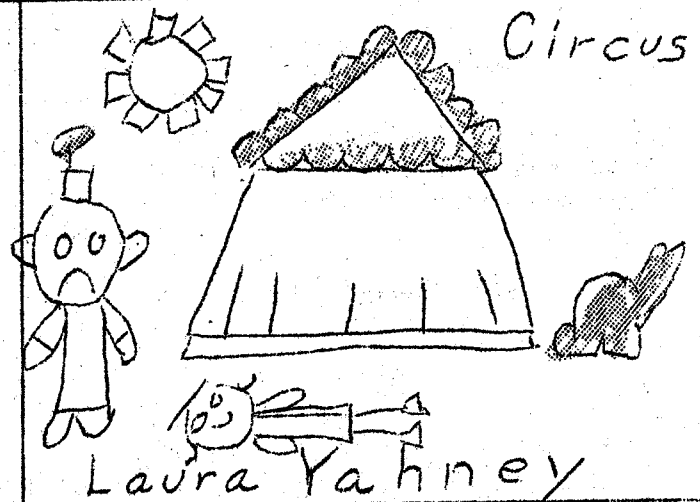
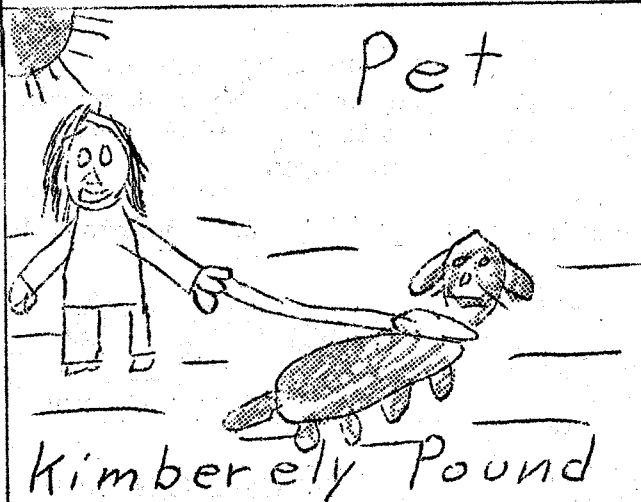

When it's a full moon.

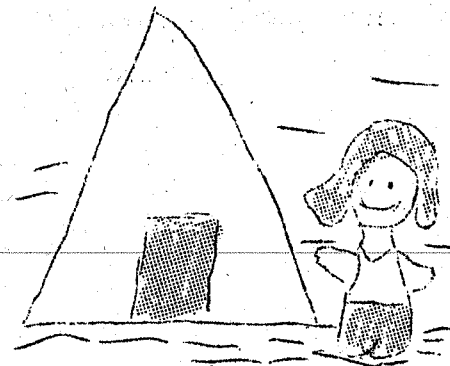
What we call the full moon is the side that we see fully lighted. Actually, it is half of the moon. The other side of the moon is the half we never see.

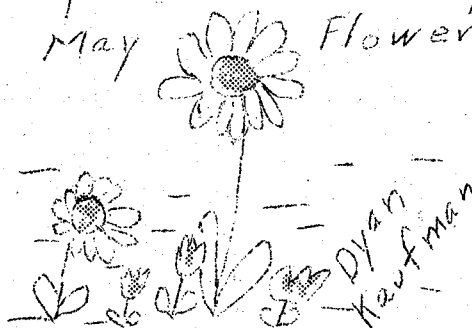

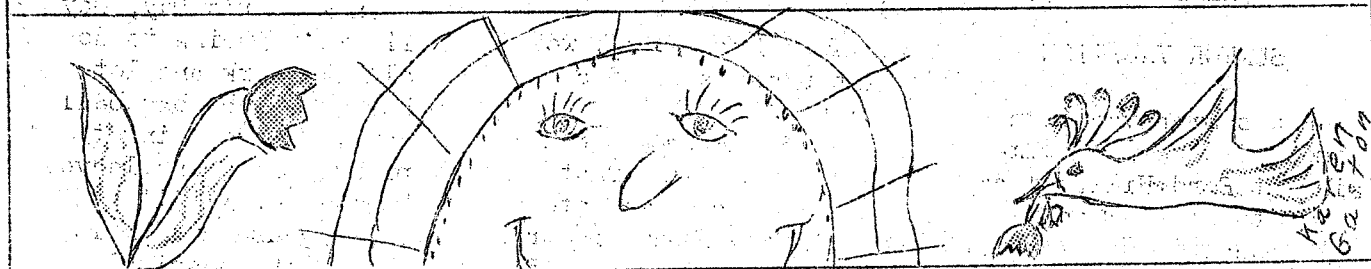

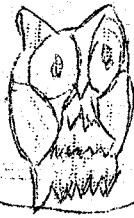
