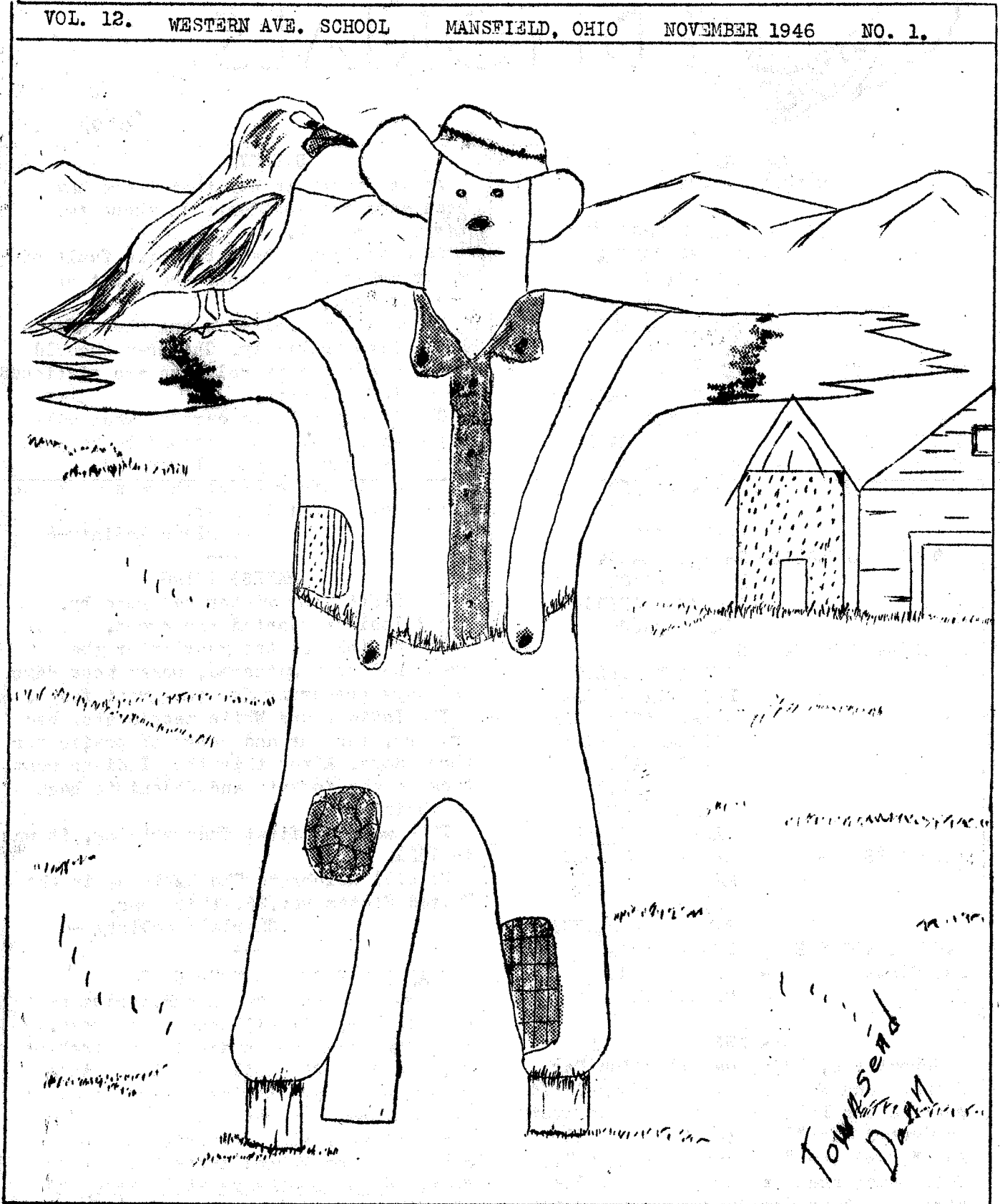
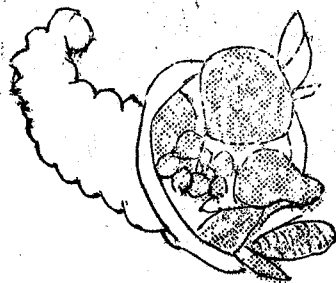

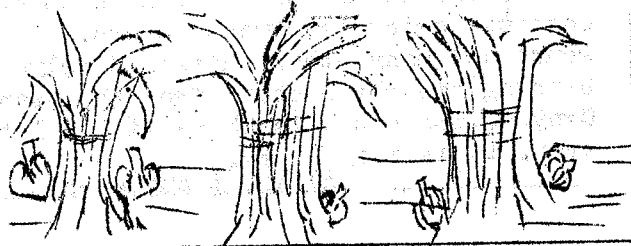

## OUR WALL SCENES

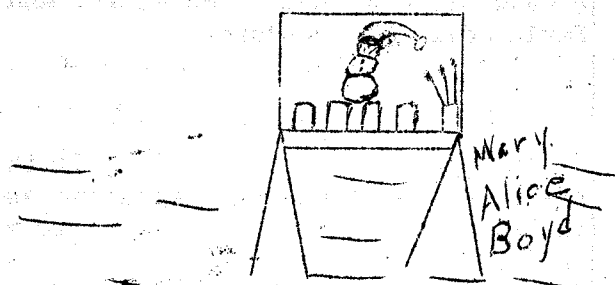

## PIONEER DAYS

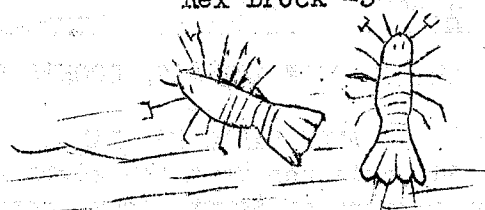
