Last week I went to the kiddie show with my friends and the movie we saw was about Mr. Toad and Ichabod Crane. Mr. Toad wanted a motor car, so he

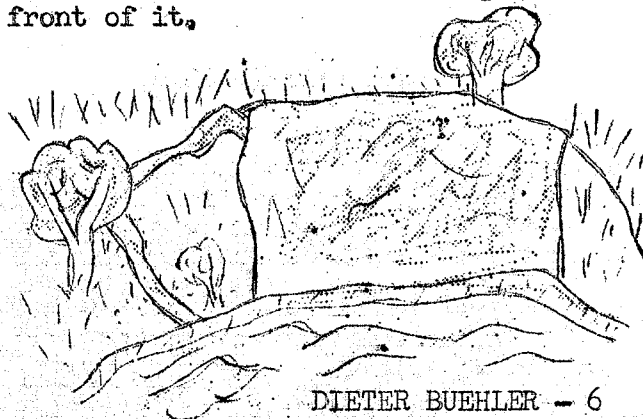
bought one. Mr. Toad was put in jail for stealing it, but he got out in a few years. When he escaped he got a deed showing he was innocent.
