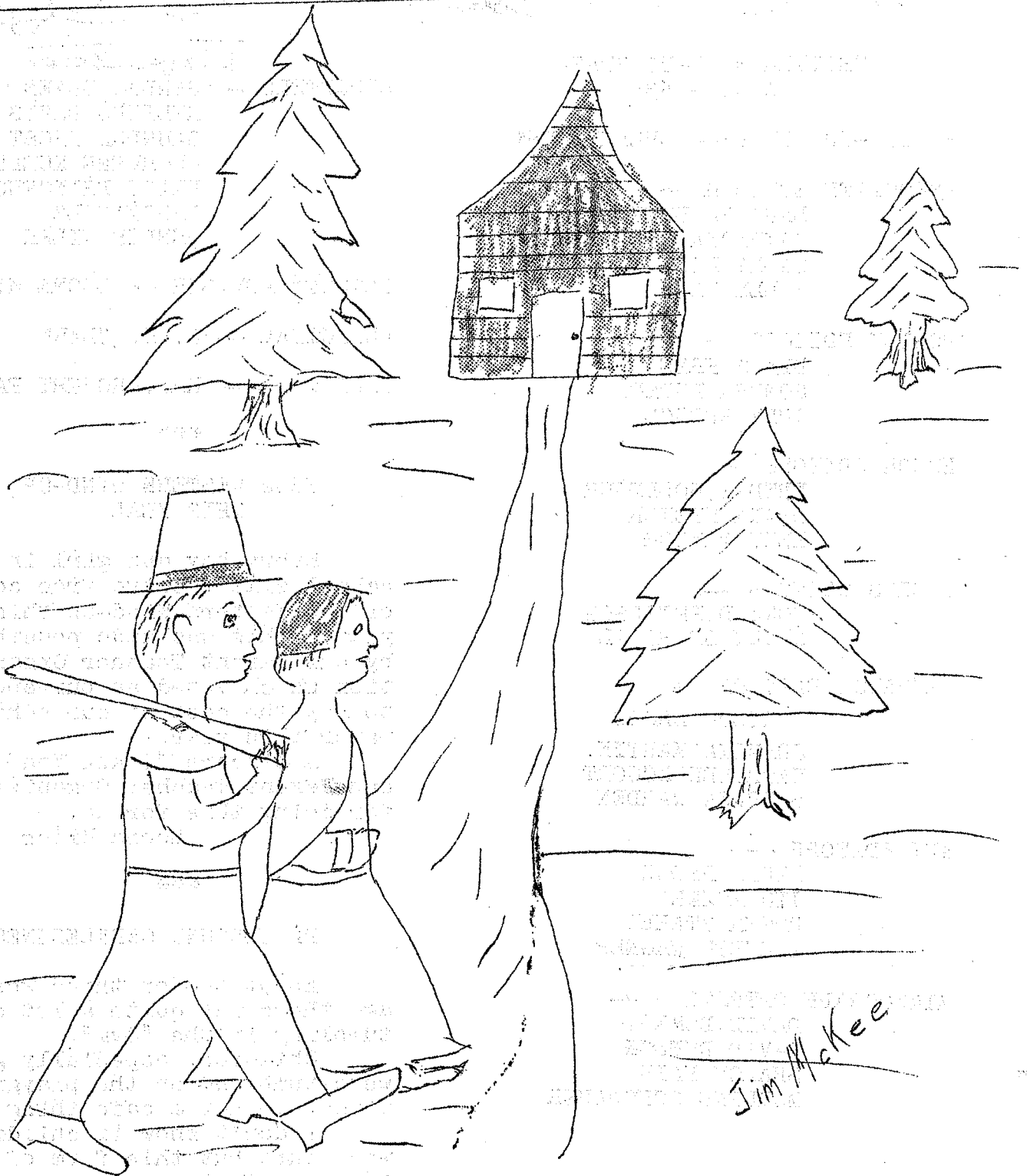
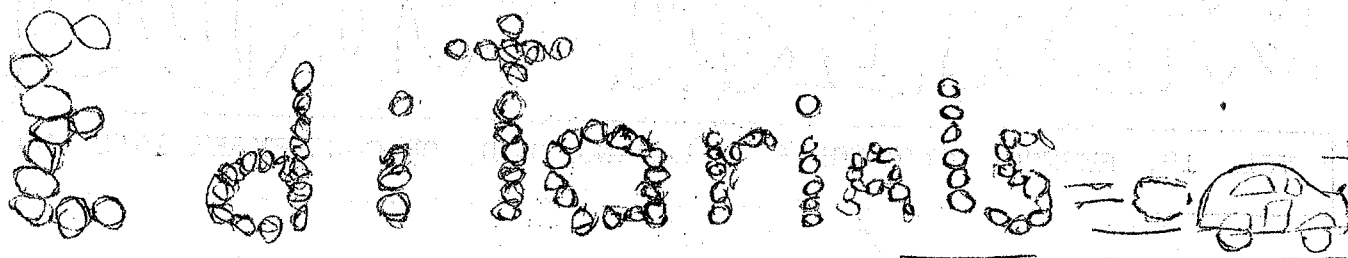

PLAYGROUND CARELESSNESS

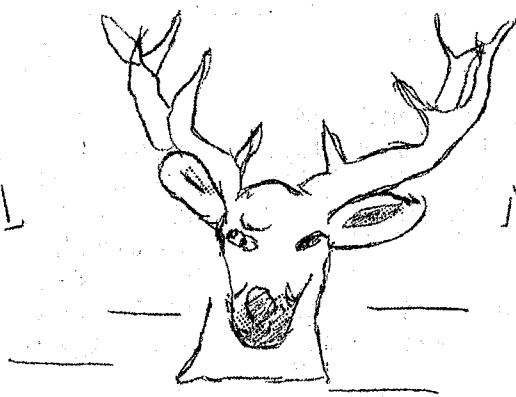
About two or three weeks ago there was quite a lot of tumbling in the "Gym".

He teaches fourth, fifth and sixth grades.

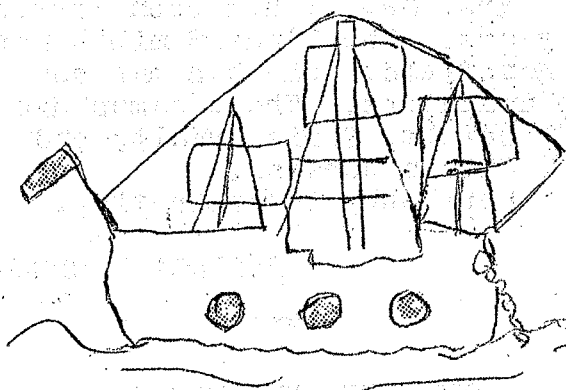
Before coming to Grubaugh, Mr. Garnes taught at Willard High School. Last year he taught at Hedges.

Several weeks ago we read in our History books about Egyptian scrolls.

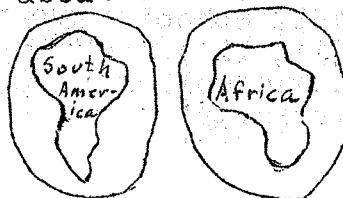
We were asked to make a scroll at home, which we made from two sticks and white shelf paper or light brown paper sack.

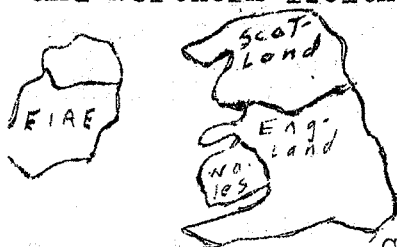

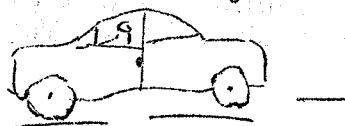

Last Summer I got some snails. After having them for a while a few died. One windy day my snail-bowl blew over. I tried to find them. I only found one.

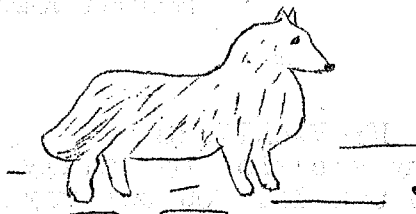
One day I went to feed my snail and I found a bunch of little babies. Now I have plenty of snails.

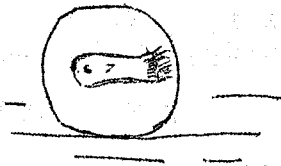
MY GOLD FISH

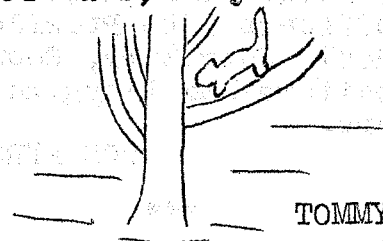
OUR HALLOWEEN PARTY

OUR HICKORY TREE

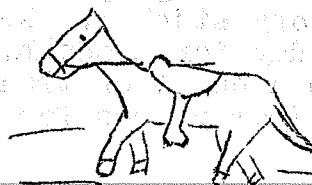

MY HORSE SILVER

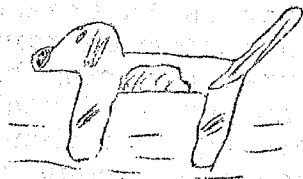

MY PET

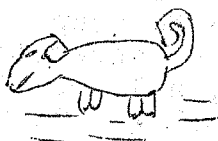

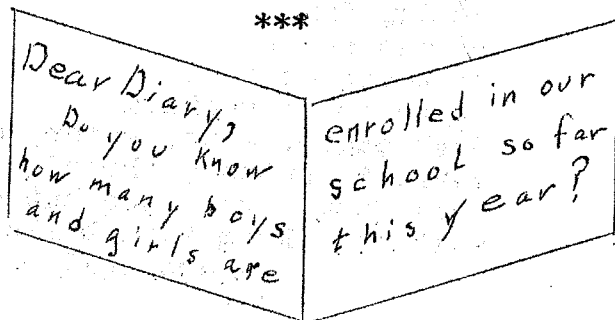

Miss M. White was interested in the whole tour through the Westinghouse.

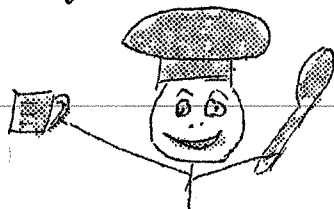
Miss Wolf went to the Gorman Rupp Co. She liked how they made the different kinds of pumps.

COOK'S CORNER

Here are some recipes for you to try! HAVE FUN!



RICE KRISPIE SQUARES

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pound marshmallows (about $2\frac{1}{2}$ doz.)

$\frac{1}{3}$ Teaspoon vanilla flavoring
 5 cup Kellogg's Rice Krispies
 Cook butter and marshmallows over boiling water until syrupy, stirring frequently.

Add vanilla. Beat thoroughly. Put Rice Krispies in greased large bowl and pour on marshmallow mixture, stirring briskly.

Press into greased shallow pan; cut into squares when cool. Yield: 24 squares, about 2 inches each. (13 / 9 inch pan).

$\frac{1}{2}$ # noodles - cooked in salted water

1 can corn beef - broken apart with a fork

1 can mushroom soup

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup water - rinse out soup can and add to soup

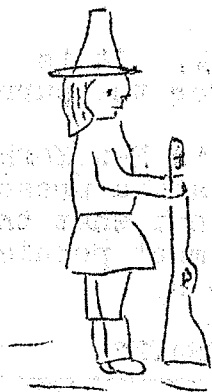
One week out of the year is set aside for Book Week. It is usually held the second week in November. It is held for the purpose of creating more interest in reading.
