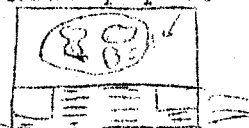

BASEBALL SPELLING TOURNAMENT

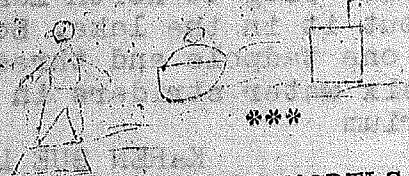

For Science some of the girls in our room made some models of pioneers. They took story book dolls and got some material and made a pattern. Then they sewed the material together. The dolls looked very nice.

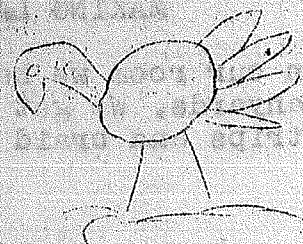

We are going to make Apple Turkeys. We are going to make them out of toothpicks, paper and apple. They are fun to make.

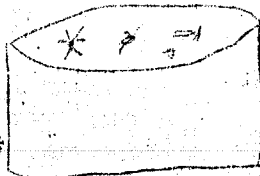
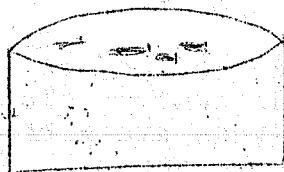

A waiting to blow away.

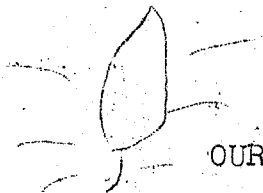

We put them on white paper and drew around them. After that we painted them different colors like you might see on the ground. We had fun doing it.

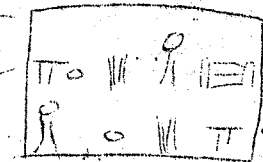

Then this is the way to make t other kind of turkey. First you make a circle, then make a half circle. Then make the head, feet and eyes. And this is the way we made turkeys.

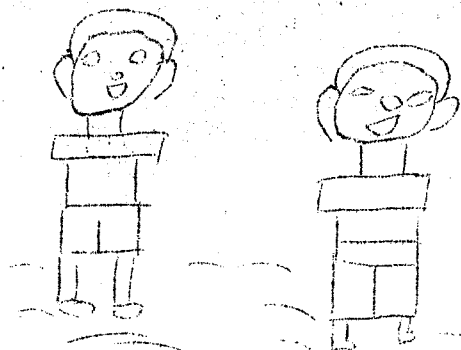

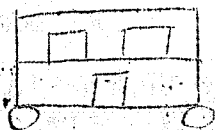
Then we went to Cincinnati. There we ate lunch. Then we went to the zoo. We started home at 3:30 and got home at 9:30.

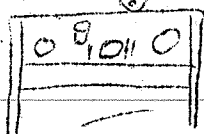

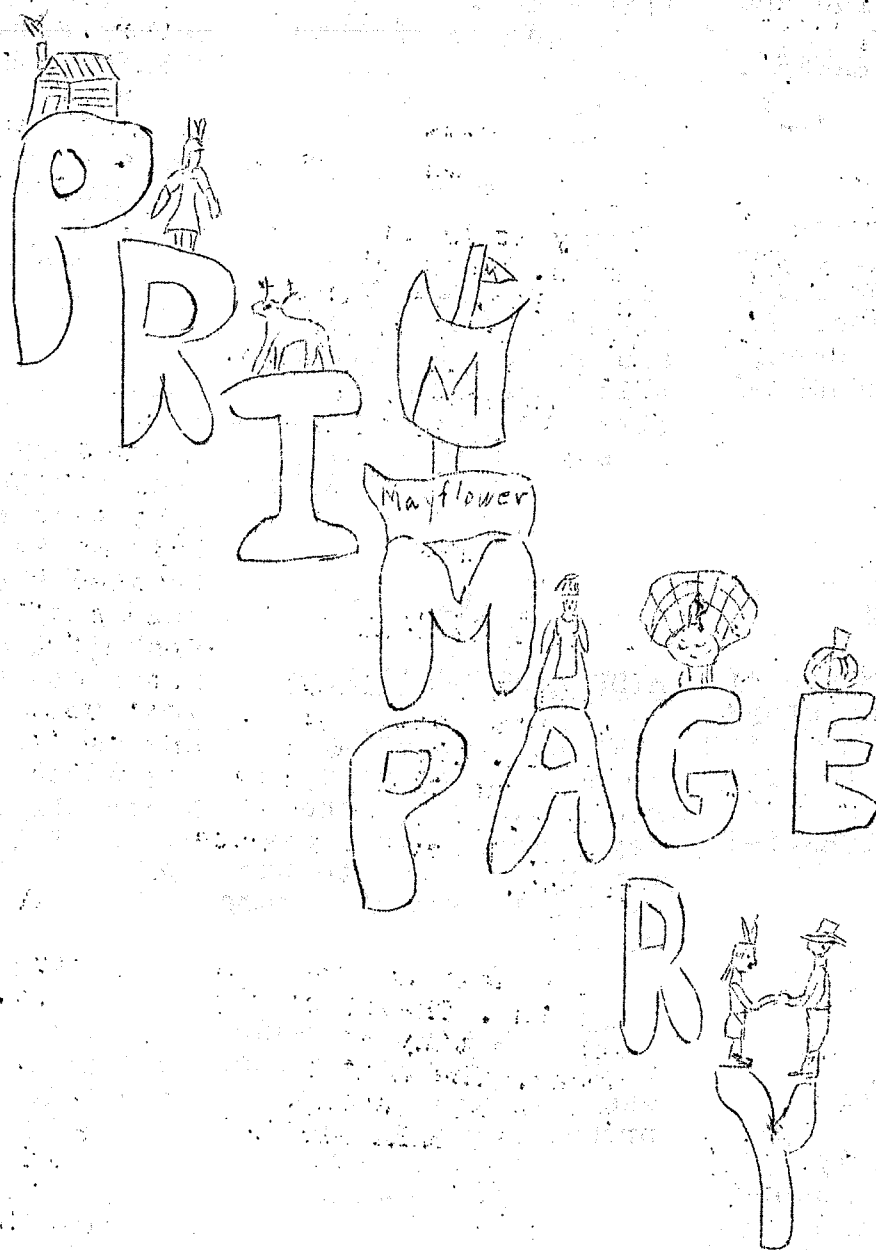

I brought a snake plant to school. I put it on the window sill. It has six leaves. We water it once a week.

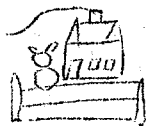
