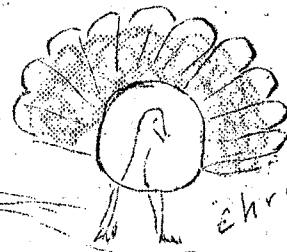
SCHOOL INSURANCE

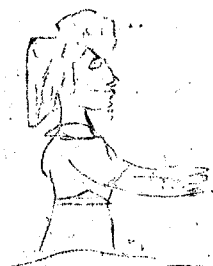
P. T. A. MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

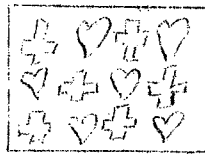
ART WORK

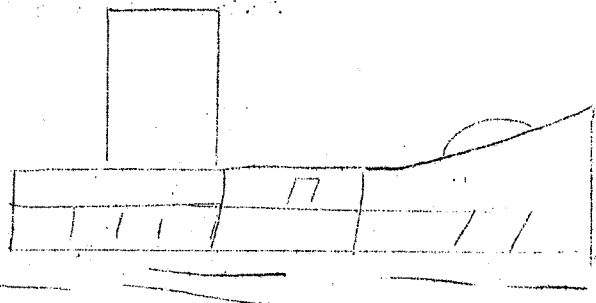


UNITED NATIONS POSTER

THE CLUBHOUSE

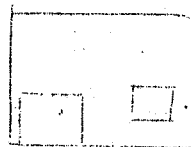
The Clubhouse was fun to make.

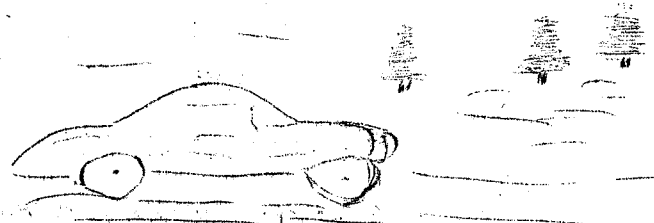
MY TRIP

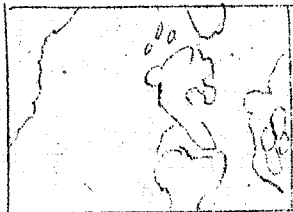
WORLD NEWS OF THE WEEK

Cook rice according to the directions on the package. Meanwhile combine soups with $\frac{1}{2}$ cups water in saucepan. Heat, then add rice. Put in large tureen and serve in bowls. This recipe will make four ample servings.
