OUR TRIP TO THE AIRPORT
INSIDE THE HANGAR

Inside the hangar we saw a jet. The name of the jet was F84F Thunder Jet. It was sometimes called 52-7057. The jet weighs 10 tons. The jet has six guns. Four of the guns were in the front. One gun was placed on each wing.

The next thing we saw was the parachute room. In this room we saw a man folding a parachute. There are two different kinds of parachutes. One chute is made to go into the planes. The other kind is made to go into a flyer's pack. In the pack is a gun, fishline, food, raft, and ammunition.

After that we saw an engine room. The jet engine does not have cylinders. The engine would cost about \$7,000.

Then we got to see a big airplane. It could carry 25 people and 3 crewmen. The plane was 94 feet wide and 106 feet long. It had 14 cylinders. It also had two emergency hatches. Each motor had 1200 horse power. The plane could go 180 miles an hour. It weighed 25,000 pounds.

RESCUE STATION

In the rescue station were three trucks. One was nine years old. We got to get inside it.

Next we got to wear a fireman's hat.

WEATHER STATION

In the weather station we got to see maps, rain gauge, thermometers, barometers, a weather balloon that was full of helium.

We got to see on a map where all the radar stations were. We wanted to see the wet-dry bulb thermometers and what the weather forecast was to be.

We went outside and saw the rain gauge. They leave a small hole in the middle for the rain to get in.

The barometer has helped forecasters to forecast the weather days ahead of time.

They use balloons to see how high the clouds are. They must tie the radiosonde on it. That is the way they find out how high the clouds are.

We learned the teletype can type 100 words a minute.

We saw the wet-dry bulb thermometers. They leave holes so the air can get in the small building enclosure.

The hygrometer is used for measuring rain.

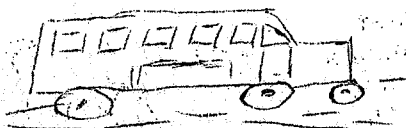




MY TRIP TO GETTSBURG

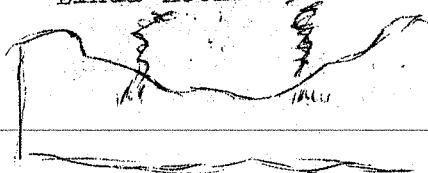

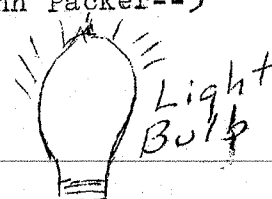


OUR VACARION

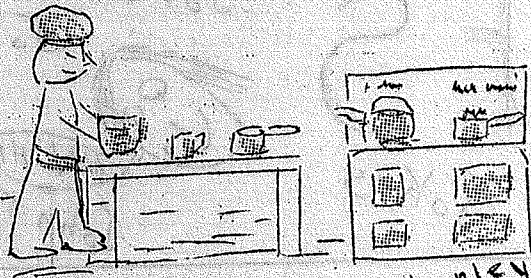

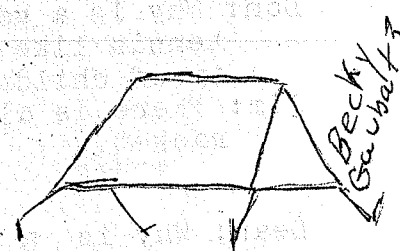

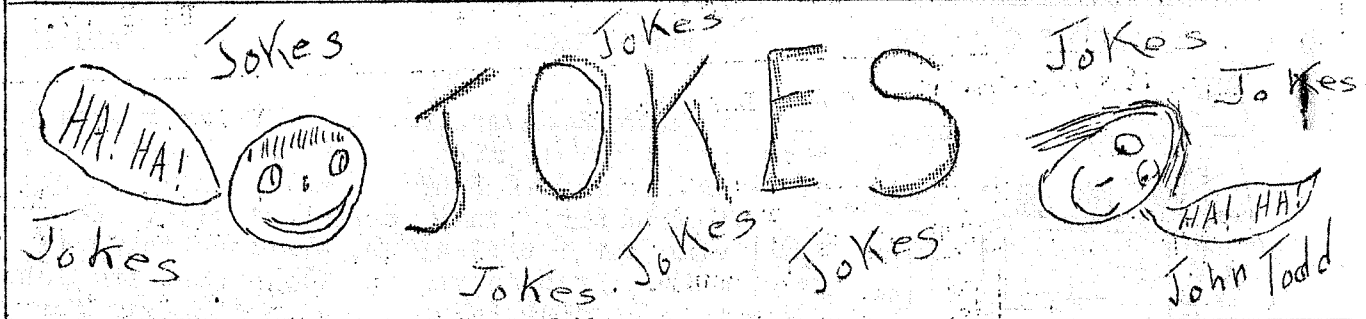
