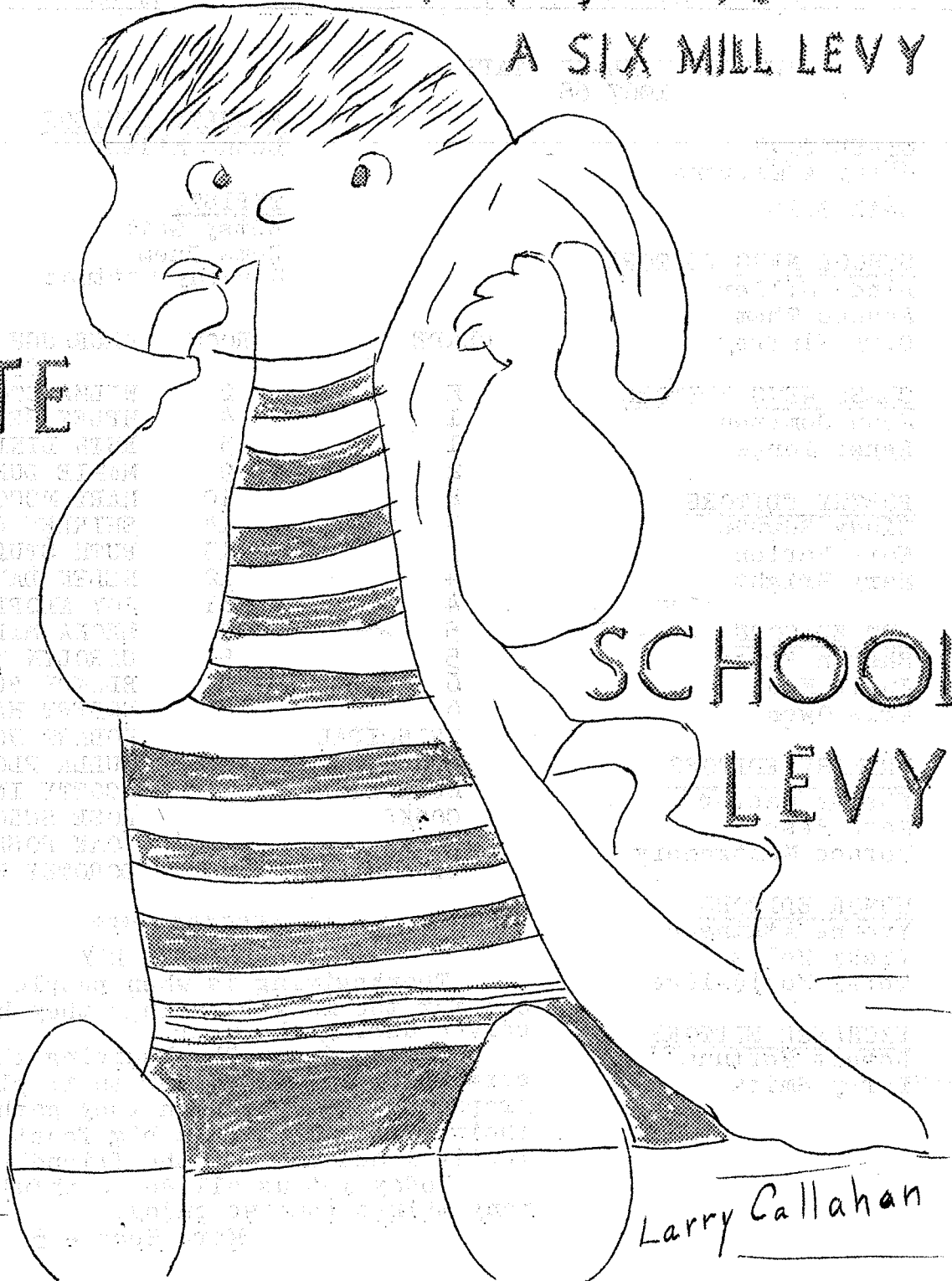

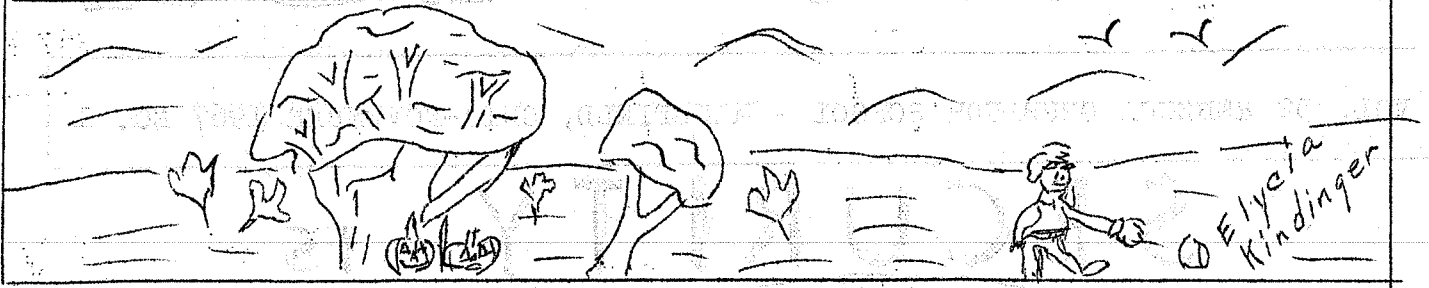

THANKSGIVING DAY

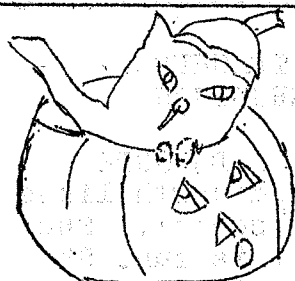
Thanksgiving is when people thank God for the many blessings they have received during the year.

This Saturday we play Prospect at Johnny Appleseed School.

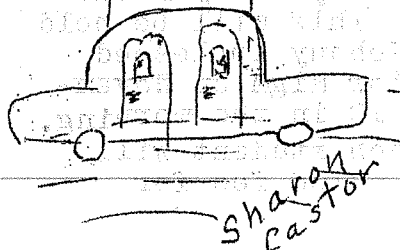

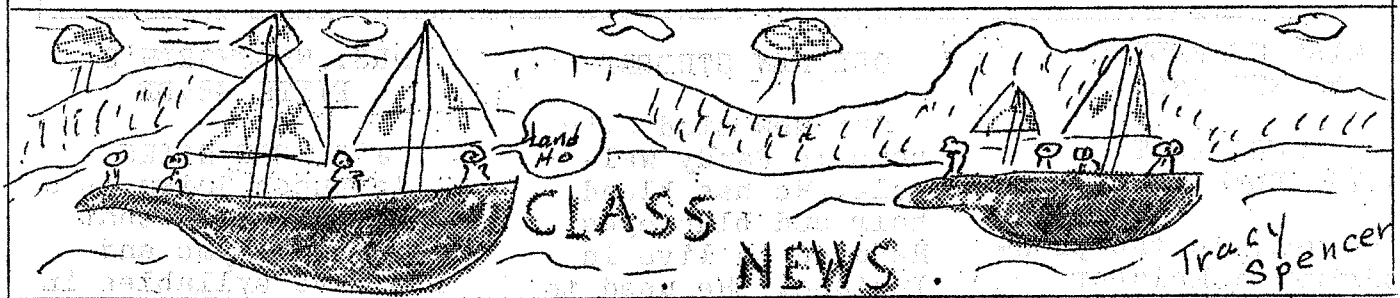
CHEER LEADERS

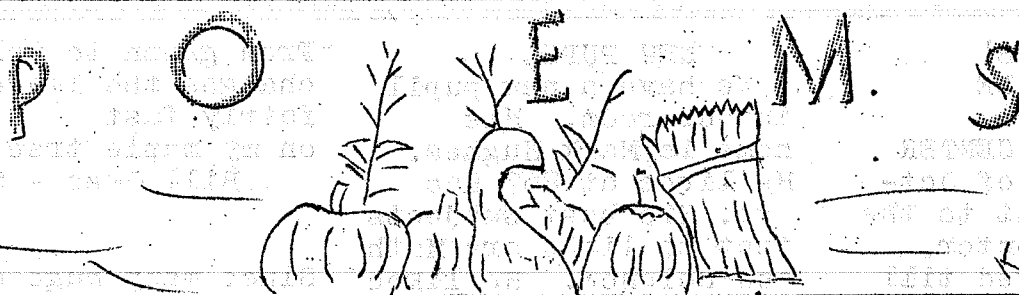
FOOTBALL
