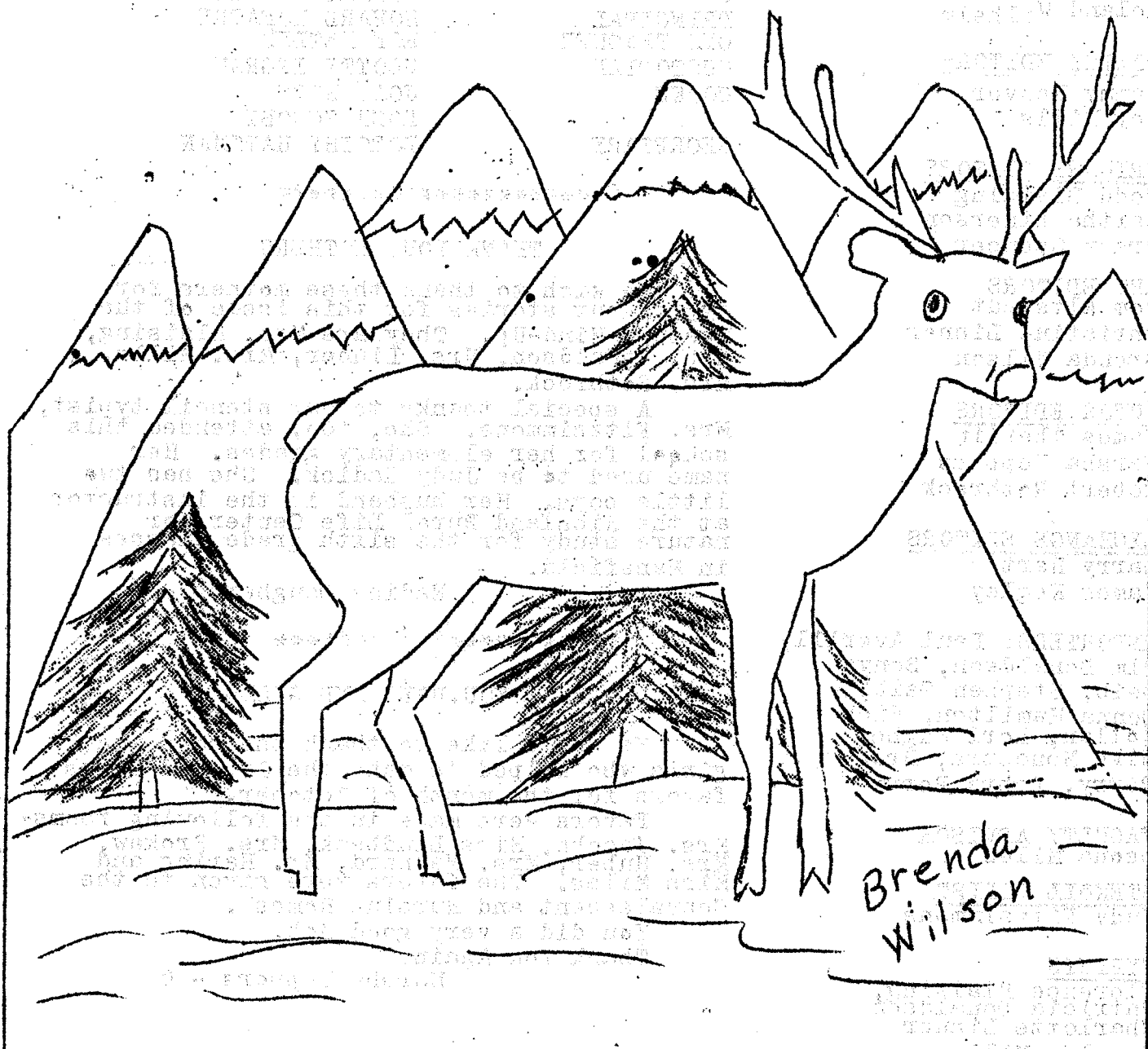

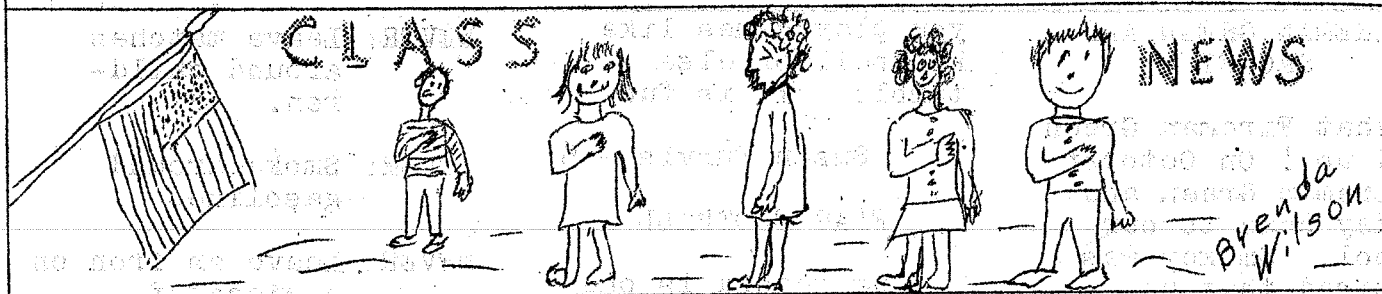
CHEERLEADING

DEER HUNTING

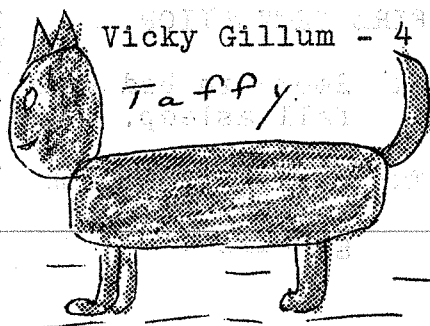

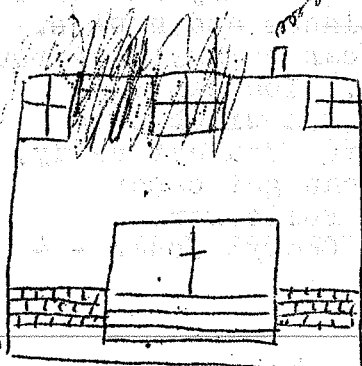

OUR NEW PUPIL

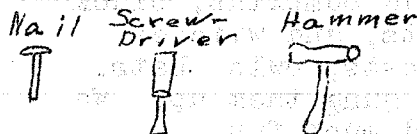

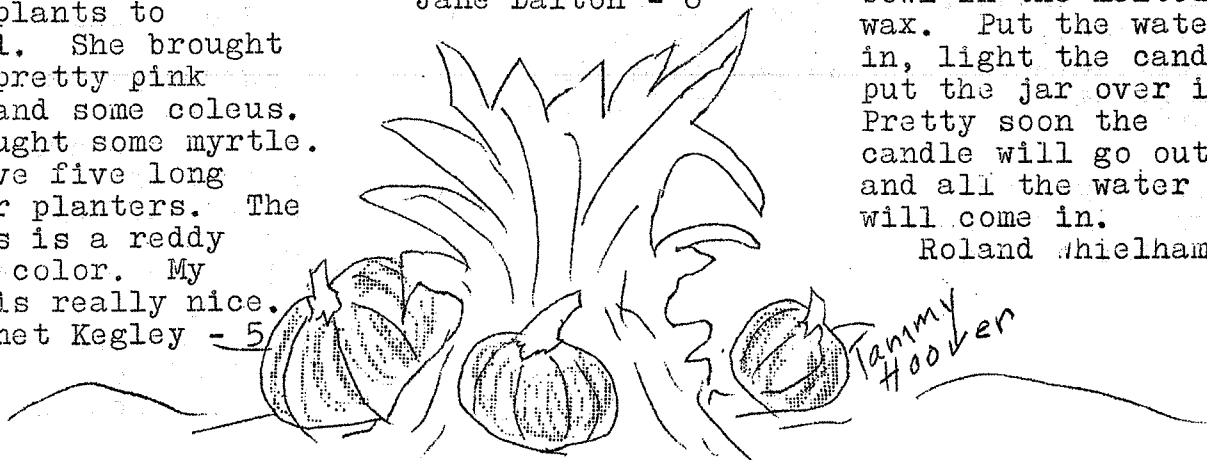
HOBBIES

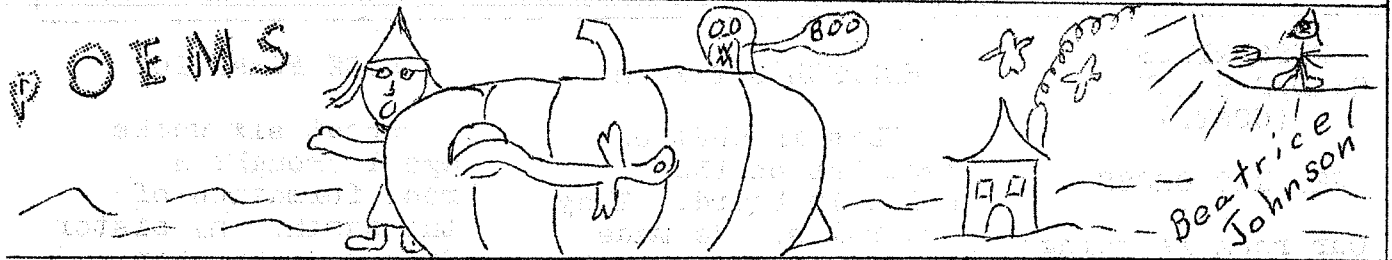
You will need: a candle and a jar, water, matches, and a bowl.
