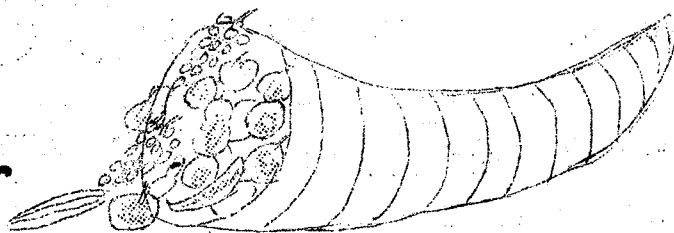

The pilgrims so had rough times but with help they managed somehow.

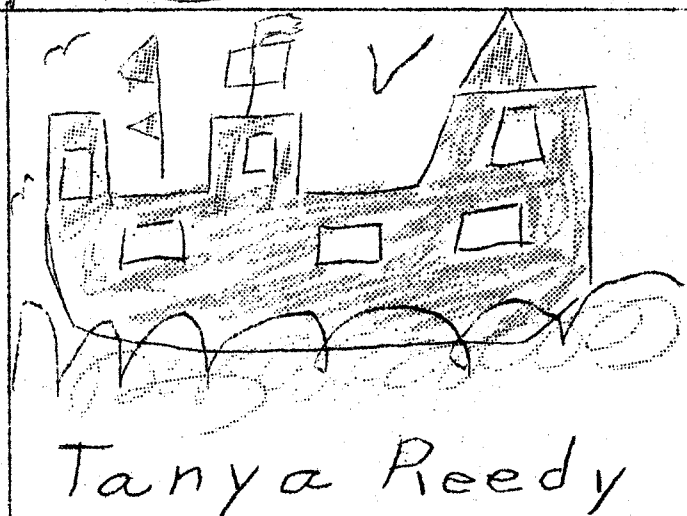
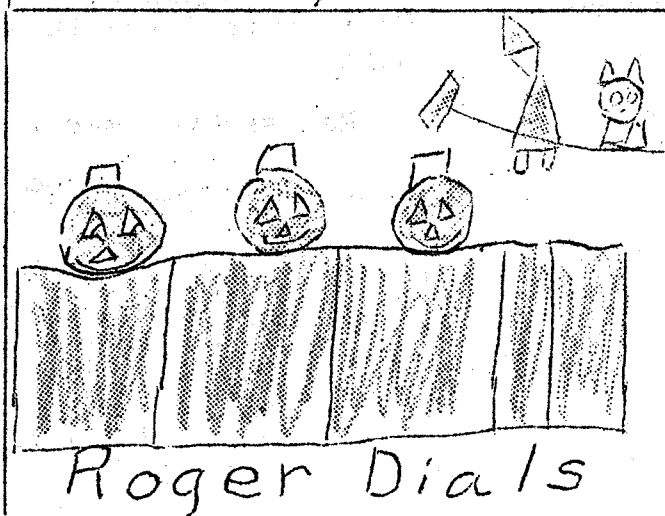
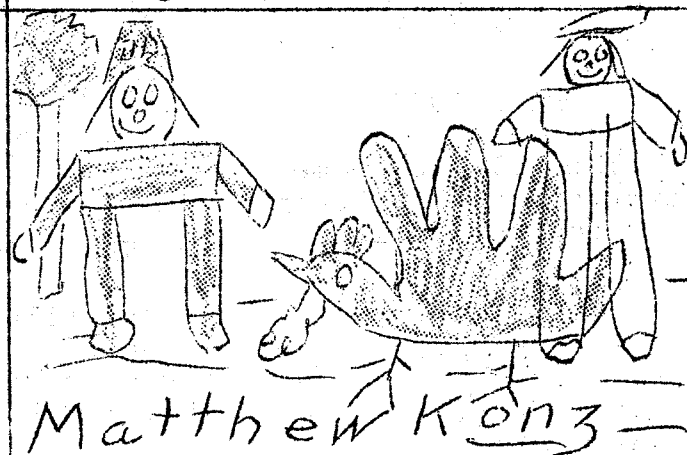
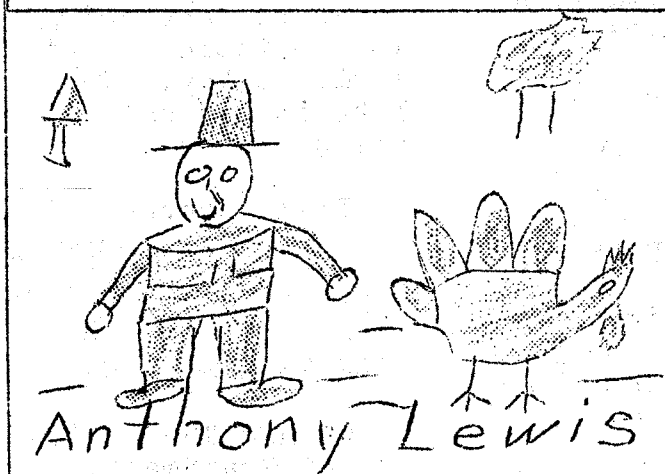
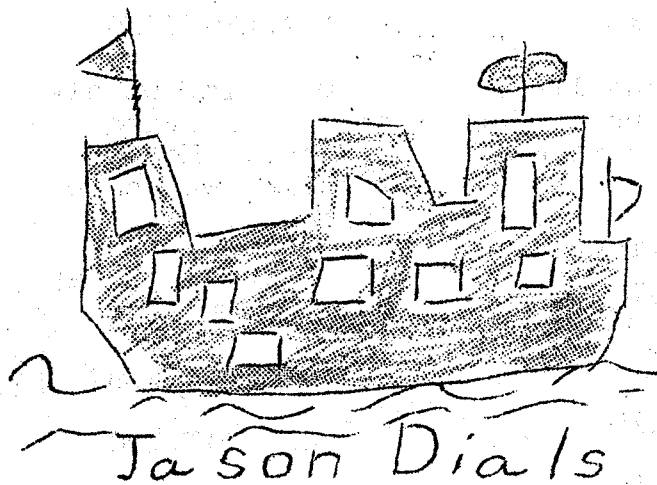

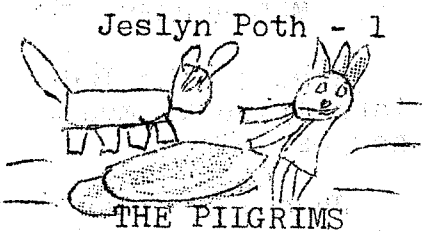

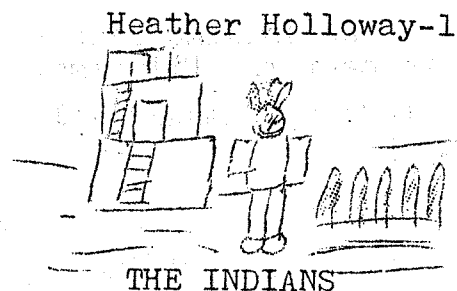
